Please be **very** aware of "black ice." This almost-transparent form of ice can sometimes accumulate on outdoor surfaces and is extremely difficult for the naked eye to detect. During this time of year, the Security department responds to a high number of emergencies that are the result of a person slipping and falling on black ice. Storing Ice Melt or salt in the house is an excellent idea, as slippery walkways can be treated without having to first use those walkways to access the Ice Melt or salt in your garage.

Please also be aware that "black ice" is often found on roadways and can make driving quite dangerous. Be sure to obey all local traffic signs and give yourself plenty of room for stopping!

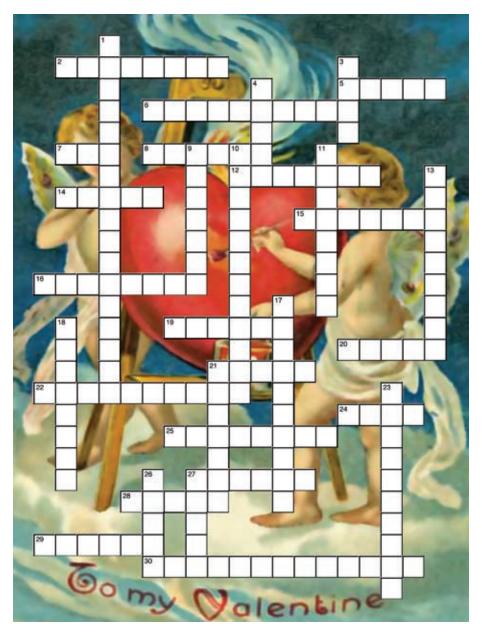

#### MA Board of Directors

Hopefully, by now, you have heard that the Master Association is considering significant renovation of the Pool House Facility. You may also have heard some very high cost figures, perhaps as much as \$1 million. The reality is the Master Association has only conducted a fea-

sibility study and has just now engaged the architect to begin the process of developing Schematic Design and Design Development based on Guidelines developed by the Master Association in cooperation with the Pool Committee and the Sports Group.

The goal of the Master Association is that the renovated Pool House Facility will promote the

image of Hershey's Mill as a premier Active Adult Community. The design and features of the Facility were defined to meet the current and anticipated future needs of the Master Association, the Villages, and the many "Mill" activity groups.

This article is an attempt to dispel rumors and clarify actions taken by the Master Association regarding plans for the Pool House Facility. The Pool House is approximately 40 years old; it is not only outdated, but in poor condition and inadequate for today's usage. During the Vision Quest Focus Group meetings and surveys of representatives throughout the "Mill", the Pool House was identified as a priority item for much needed betterment and improvement.

As a result of this evaluation conducted by Board of Directors member Harry Staller – with participation by Tom Daley representing the architectural firm of Daley and Jalboot (D&J), and Carol Campanelli, Pool Committee Chairperson – the needs for a renovated pool house facility were developed. These needs include those desired by the Pool Committee: a year



round Pool House (used by the Sports Group) with an enlarged main room (current Mermaid Cove), improved kitchen, improved locker facilities and storage space. The Master Association identified the need for private meeting space to supplement that of the current Community Center (available for any Community use during those times when the pool is closed). The conservative preliminary estimate for such renovation is approximately \$800,000.

A "Design Guidance" list was formulated to identify the features and requirements for the Pool House Facility. The list was shared with all Village Presidents and revised and finalized at the January 8 Master Association meeting. This list will be used by D&J to refine their initial concept into the final version of the Pool House Facility. D&J has submitted a proposal for

this next phase of the project (i.e. full architectural and engineering design services) at a total cost of \$92,000 (\$72,000 architectural fee and \$20,000 for the required civil engineering). After evaluation and discussion, the Master Association passed a motion to approve only the Schematic Design (to be completed by April 15th) and Design Development (April through July) efforts (\$25,200) of this proposal. Additionally, the necessary engineering survey at a cost of \$8,500 was

approved and was completed in January. The results of these contracted efforts (updated Facility Design and revised cost estimate) will be presented to the Master Association and will provide the information needed to make a decision on further implementation of the project.

The Master Association believes that the above action is the appropriate approach for evaluating and implementing this project.

## Pool House Facility Progress Report

#### Pool House Facility - Design Guidance

**Aesthetic Characteristics** – The renovated Pool House should be an attractive building. The design should incorporate features that reflect an appreciation of style and quality.

**Design Guidance** – The Pool House Facility concept provided is a starting point for the desired buildings. The key features desired in the final design are:

#### **Pool House**

- Location on or near current building site.
- A single story structure design for year round usage including air conditioning for summer usage.
- Provide an expanded meeting/party room of approximately 800 square feet.
- Provide an adjacent screened in porch.
- Provide both male and female rest room facilities appropriate for a senior population, with provisions for handicapped usage.
- Provide convenient storage area adjacent to the main room for tables and chairs.
- Provide adequate kitchen facilities.

#### **Locker Room and Pool Staff Office**

- Replace or renovate current locker room and improve ambiance and appearance. *Note:* this room is only for pool season usage.
- If possible, increase the size/number of shower's in the Women's Room
   space could be taken from the Men's changing area.
- Provide a pool staff office of approximately the current size. *Note:* this room is only for pool season usage and can be combined with the locker room.

#### Storage Building/Area

Expand storage area to accommodate pool and sports group equipment.
 Note: Storage area can be separate building or prefab shed without heating or cooling.

#### Other Pool House Site Features

- Provide features that prevent access to pool area when pool is closed and during off season.
- Provide features that permit access to main building and restrooms when pool is closed and during off season.
- Incorporate lighting in and around Pool House and parking area suitable for night usage.

#### **Facility Cost and Operational Expenses**

- Design and construction techniques and features that minimize cost should be utilized.
- Equipment operational efficiency should be major criteria in systems selection.
- Design characteristics and features that have significant cost impact should be identified along with lower cost options.

All residents should be aware that the Pool House Facility and other Vision Quest programs will be implemented without resident assessment increases.

#### **VALENTINE'S DAY CRAFT**

We hope that you enjoy the beautiful, unique, and hand-crafted Valentine's Day heart that adorns this Guide and Digest cover; and another variation on the Activities Calendar. These were both created by the marvelous local crafter Catherine Palmquist who has graciously shared them with us.

There are approximately 36 million heart shaped chocolate boxes sold each year. The way we see it, that is a craft project just waiting for you. Good for the earth, great for using up those small

fabric scraps, easy

to do, quick and fun;

of course, burning off

those chocolate calories is an entirely

separate project – hello pickleball!

Just about any size box can be used and it doesn't matter whether you use the top, bottom, or both. Note that many boxes have a



flange on the top and/or bottom sections that we like; it frames the box nicely and guides the edge banding.

> Getting started is as easy as choosric squares, and some mini-cuptemperature glue gun works quickly

but isn't necessary. Construction begins by placing the empty papers in

ing a box, fabcake papers; then obtaining some soft stuffing along with fabric glue and ribbon. A low

the box to determine how large the candies should be. Once determined, cut fabric and place a small wad of stuffing inside each to create a ball with a pinched seam at one spot. This can be glued shut (or sewn), then glued into a paper to hide the seam. To create a truly unique look, make papers by folding your own.

Next, wrap the edge of the box in either fabric or ribbon and glue a seam at the indent of the heart. If the box sides are to your liking, you can leave them as is. Now it's time to dry-fit the fabric

they can be as tight or

loose as you desire. It may

take some practice to get the candies

made and fitted in the box just right, but even a first try usually looks great.

To finish up the project, just add your ribbon (or even a pre-made bow) with a dab of

glue.

Happy Valentine's Day When dry, this can be propped up, placed on a plate stand, or a stick-on picture hook can be added for hanging. That's all there is to it, though the variations are endless.

For a more realistic look, you might try

using the actual candy papers, and fabrics in shades of brown: maybe even some brown and gold puff paint to mimic chocolate top decorations. Have fun with this project, alone or in a group, and let us know if you need a hand emptying out all of those

chocolate boxes.

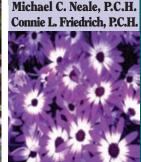

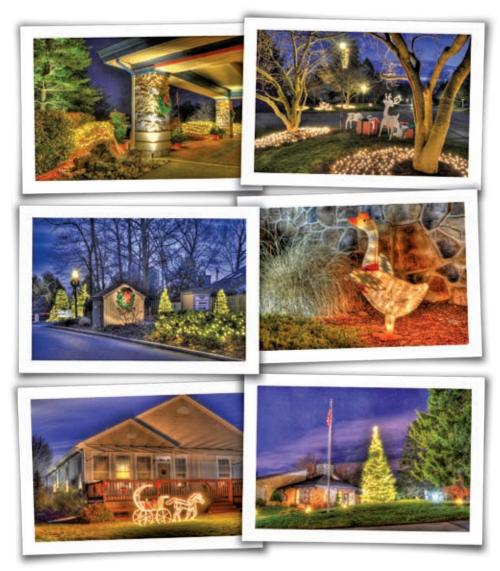

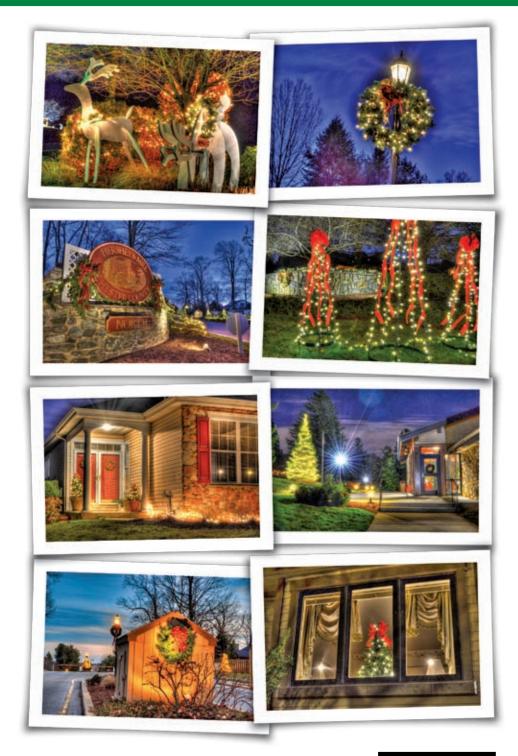

AdwCleaner is another free malware cleanup program that can be utilized should your computer become infected. Of course, if you have previously installed my recommendation of Malwarebytes, you may not need AdwCleaner. However, I have seen several

have chosen to download. Always remove check marks next to selections for unneeded programs other than the one you want; and *read very carefully* each installation window to see if additional software may be installed by other means. I have seen selections of PUPS embedded in fake license information. You seldom need a license for a free program or a trial of a program.

## **AdwCleaner**

cases and have been told by another user that AdwCleaner removed some malware that Malwarebytes did not detect. This is a common issue in the industry. Each anti-malware company uses its proprietary detection and removal methods and the results will differ. Anti-virus programs work the same way. No two will produce the same detection and removal results.

AdwCleaner detects and removes the same type of malware that Malware-bytes does. It will remove browser hijackers, toolbars, and other unwanted programs. Often these potentially unwanted programs (PUPS) come bundled with a program that you may

Unfortunately these PUPS can also infect your computer simply by visiting a web site without clicking on anything. It can be very frustrating when you get infected, but having the right tools at your disposal can minimize the pain.

As good as Malwarebytes is, it's not perfect. A second opinion is always a good idea. I recommend that when Malwarebytes detects an infection and it's quarantined, you follow up with a scan using AdwCleaner. This program works well on its own, but better yet in conjunction with Malwarebytes.

My recommended free security installations (three total) are Malwarebytes,



Bitdefender Anti-Virus, and Adw-Cleaner. Malwarebytes can be downloaded from www.malwarebytes.org. Bitdefender can be downloaded from www.bitdefender.com/solutions/free. html. And AdwCleaner can be downloaded from https://toolslib.net/downloads/viewdownload/1-adwcleaner/.

If using Bitdefender, remember to uninstall or turn off any other anti-virus program (such as Norton, McAfee, etc). Only one anti-virus program should be active on a computer.

After any of the programs are downloaded, you will probably find them in your Downloads folder. Double click them to install.



Once AdwCleaner is installed, start it by clicking the Scan button and then allow it to proceed. After scanning you may see some entries in the various Results categories such as Services, Files, Folders, etc. After it finishes scanning, click the Clean button. This will remove the unwanted entries. Reboot the computer and repeat the process until no issues are detected.

#### Joe Kennedy | Princeton

The Sixth United States Colored Infantry, largely recruited and wholly trained in our region, fought as free men for the Union, but at enormous personal cost.

In his book, *Strike the Blow for Freedom* (White Mane Books), James M. Paradis of Abington tells the story of this unit,

which suffered mass casualties to illness, battle and the emotional trauma of war. The book, which adds to a growing number of histories of black Civil War regiments, offers sound scholarship with a human face.

"I've had a lifelong interest in the Civil War," said Paradis in an interview. Paradis is currently Dean of the Upper School at St. Mary's

Hall-Doane Academy in Burlington, N.J., and a frequent participant

in Civil War Round Tables.

Colored soldiers near Dutch Gap about November 1864.

Using primary sources from the National Archives – such as letters, muster rolls, service records and official orders of the Sixth – Paradis has drawn a profile of the officers and men of the unit for the book; which was also

his doctoral dissertation at Temple.

Paradis pieced together anecdotes about a few men from the ranks, in which the Rev. Jeremiah Asher, the regiment's chaplain, is a standout. Born in Connecticut in 1812, Asher became the pastor of the Shiloh Baptist Church

in Philadelphia. He was a civil-rights reformer and campaigned for the establishment of black regiments. One of 14 African Americans among 133 chaplains who served black troops, Asher wrote a memoir of his experiences.

"His writing bears special importance because black soldiers ... were usually deprived of the opportunity for formal

education and of the chance to tell their own story," Paradis notes. African Americans became Union soldiers as a result of the Emancipation Proclamation of January 1863, which removed the barrier that kept black men out of the armed forces. Camp William Penn then was established in Cheltenham Township to train black soldiers. Nearly 11,000 African Americans

that made up 11 regiments were trained at this camp between 1863 and 1865.

The Sixth



was the second regiment raised and trained there. While men came from 23 states, most were recruited from Philadelphia and the surrounding area.

While 43 percent of the soldiers in the Sixth were volunteers, some were

draftees and substitutes for those drafted. Most were laborers with little or no education. Their average height was 5 feet  $6\frac{1}{2}$  inches and their median age was 23.

The discrimination that was rife in segregated society at the time continued

fications and dug a canal on the James River. "Black troops often took on heavy fatigue duty," Paradis writes. And in these projects, the Sixth, like many other black units, took heavy casualties from sickness, exhaustion and shelling. As a result, by the time the Sixth was ordered to assault the Confederate line

# 6th United States Colored Infantry Regiment

for the men in the Union army. White soldiers were paid \$13 a month with a clothing allowance of \$3.50. Black soldiers were paid \$10 per month with a clothing allowance of \$3, and that came out of their base pay. Black troops were

defending Richmond and Petersburg at New Market Heights, it could muster only 367 men of the more than 1,000 originally in the regiment.

The men were ordered to attack an entrenched Confederate line across an open field. They were not able to breach the line and sustained 210 casualties – either killed, wounded or missing.

Three men – Capt. Nathan Edgerton, a white



commanded by white officers and black soldiers could rise no higher than noncommissioned officer.

The Sixth left Camp William Penn in October 1863 and traveled by sea to Virginia. From the time of arrival until September 1864, soldiers of the Sixth used picks and shovels rather than rifles as they dug trenches, worked on forti-

officer; and Sgt. Alexander Kelly and Thomas Hawkins, both black noncommissioned officers – were awarded the Medal of Honor for their courage in protecting the regimental flag. Other sol-

diers who survived the horror of that day would carry psychological wounds for the rest of their lives, Paradis writes. Some lost their sanity or committed suicide, he said. That was an additional price paid by the men of the Sixth who struck a blow for freedom.

February is a great month to stay cozy inside and treat loved ones and friends to something special. We've put together a menu full of new flavors, healthy twists, and rich experiences to warm up the kitchen and the heart of just about anyone.

#### **Torn Garlic Chive Croutons**

These craggy delights are both crisp and chewy, and are a treat atop the soup.

2 garlic cloves

1/3 cup finely chopped fresh chives

1 stick (4 ounces) unsalted butter

2 tablespoons olive oil

2 teaspoons Kosher salt

1 teaspoon black pepper

1 sourdough bread boule

Preheat oven to 400°F. Finely mince garlic and mix with finely chopped fresh chives. Soften butter in a large bowl, then add olive oil, garlic and chives, and 1½ teaspoons southern-style hot sauce

salt and pepper. Tear bread

into very rough pieces about 1½ inches. Place all at once into the bowl and toss thoroughly coat. Spread in one laver on a baking sheet and bake for about 15 minutes until

crisp on the outside and chewy on the inside. Check seasoning and add while hot if needed.

## Best served warm.

#### **East Coast Bouillabaise**

This native soup more than holds its own against the traditional European.

1 pound cod fillet

½ pound shrimp, shelled and cleaned

½ pound scallops (bay preferred)

3 cans (6.5 ounces each) chopped clams and clam juice

½ cup olive oil

2 medium onions, chopped

1 clove garlic, chopped

1 green bell pepper, chopped

½ red bell pepper, chopped

½ cup celery, chopped

1 jar (~24 fluid ounces) homemade chunky tomato sauce

½ cup fresh tomato chunks

1 tablespoon cayenne pepper

2 tablespoons paprika

1 teaspoon cumin

2 bay leaves

2 teaspoons kosher salt

1 teaspoon black pepper

In a soup pan, saute garlic in oil until very soft, then add onion, peppers and celery, and continue cooking until just soft. Add tomato sauce, clam juice, pep-

pers, salt, bay leaves, cumin, paprika and hot sauce, and simmer for 30 minutes. Add cod fillet (will break down). shrimp, clams, scallops, tomato chunks and oil, and simmer for 2 hours. Remove bay leaves, and serve

with fresh sourdough croutons.

#### **Green Pea Risotto**

This rich dish is great alone or under the Salmon and that terrific orange sauce.

6½ cups of vegetable stock ½ cup dry white wine

1 clove garlic, finely minced

2 tablespoons olive oil

3 tablespoons unsalted butter

2 cups Arborio rice

½ teaspoon kosher salt

½ teaspoon white pepper

½ cup grated Parmesan cheese 1/3 cup fresh green peas, steamed

Heat the stock and keep at a simmer. In a heavy saucepan, saute the chives and

garlic in olive oil and 1 tablespoon of the butter until very soft. Add the rice, salt, and pepper and cook, stirring constantly, for 2 minutes. Using a ladle, add stock ½ cup at a time, and stir rice very often (nearly constant at the beginning). Wait until liquid is absorbed before adding next ½ cup. Add the wine in place of the stock after the first ½ cup of stock is added. Continue cooking and stirring, until the rice is tender but still firm. Rice may not require all the stock. Remove from heat and stir in cheese, steamed peas, and remaining butter. Best served immediately.

#### **Orange-Glazed Salmon**

The glazed fish is moist and delicious, and we always go back for extra sauce.

2 pounds salmon fillets (or a single large fillet) 1 teaspoon kosher salt ½ teaspoon black pepper ¾ cup orange marmalade ¼ cup sliced green onions

1 clove garlic, minced

2 teaspoons dry white wine

1½ teaspoons grated fresh ginger 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard

½ teaspoon ground cavenne pepper 1/8 teaspoon Chinese five spice powder 3 tablespoons sliced, toasted almonds

Salmon skin may be removed before cooking or before service. Preheat oven to 450°F. Clean fish and dry thoroughly,

season with salt and pep-

per, and place in a shallow baking dish. In a bowl, mix the marmalade, onions, garlic, wine, ginger, mustard, pepper and five spice powder. Spoon the mixture over Salmon and bake, uncovered, for about 6-7 minutes per ½ inch of thickness (will

flake when tested); do not undercook. Serve in baking dish or portioned; plate individual fillets. Sprinkle almonds on fish just out of the oven.

3 cups torn mild lettuce leaves

34 cup diced sweet, crisp apple ½ cup walnut chunks

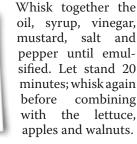
