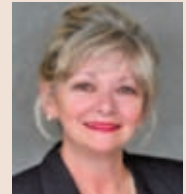

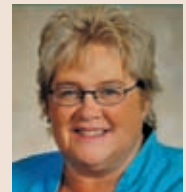

FROM THE MAIN GATE

Unfortunately, there are times when we need to call 911 in order to receive emergency medical treatment. The following is information that you should know in order to ensure a quick response by emergency personnel, as well as proper care for you or your loved one:

When dialing 911, you will be asked for:

1. Your name
2. Your address
3. Your township
4. Your telephone number
5. A cross-street
 - a. Mill Road only for Springton, Newbury, and Eaton villages
 - b. Hershey's Drive only for Westbrook Village
 - c. Mill Road or Chandler Drive for Kennett and Franklin villages
 - d. Chandler Drive only for all other villages
6. Type of emergency (what is wrong?)
7. Age of the patient

When emergency responders arrive at your house, you will be asked to provide:

1. Patient's medical history (stroke, cardiac arrest, diabetes, etc.)
2. Patient's current medications
3. Patient's allergies
4. Copy of the patient's Living Will (if applicable)

5. Recollection of events leading up to the emergency
6. Hospital preference (for transport)

Important: The emergency responders rely on the patient's feedback in order to administer the proper treatment. From time to time, you may be asked if you can walk to the stretcher or ambulance. If you feel at any time that movement or walking will cause you discomfort or pain, explain to the emergency responders that you prefer not to walk and wish to be moved or lifted onto the stretcher or into the ambulance.



What You Need To Know If Calling 911

We highly recommend making a list, or lists, containing answers to all of the necessary information listed above; and keep that list somewhere handy (purse, nightstand, kitchen counter, on the refrigerator, etc.) so that emergency responders, friends, or family can easily find it in case of emergency. Also, please do not forget to update that list as changes occur.

Hershey's Mill residents who attended the "Entertainment in the Park" concert on July 12 were treated to a great night of oldies music performed by "Webb - Band of Brothers" lead by Wally Hart. They had a wonderful time, singing and dancing into the night!

Hart. His dad's career was in the grocery business. His mother emigrated from Czechoslovakia at the age of seventeen and was a homemaker throughout Wally's childhood, later working as a seamstress in the clothing industry.

Wally began taking piano and voice lessons from the Sisters of St. Joseph at Sacred Heart Grade School in Vine-

land at a young age. He graduated from Sacred Heart High School in 1968, and

has remained in touch with many of his former teachers. His parents impressed upon him the value of hard work. Wally's first job, at the age of twelve, was at a chicken farm where he washed and graded eggs. Other summer and part-time jobs included working in a gift shop and at a car wash, a landscaping job for the state of New Jersey, shift work in a scientific glass factory, and a job with a steel fabricator where he drove forklifts and trucks.

Wally earned a Bachelor of Civil Engineering Degree from Villanova University

Superintendent for the general contractor responsible for the construction of the main Metro Station at 12th and G Streets in Washington, D.C. This job proved to be short-lived as he quickly learned that he didn't like working underground. His second job was with an engineering firm in King of Prussia specializing in highway design. The bulk of his career was spent with Allen-Sherman-Hoff, designers and suppliers of ash-handling systems for coal-fired

I recently had the pleasure of meeting Wally and his wife Silvana in their sunny Ulster home. The first thing I noticed when arriving at Wally's house was the 1967 Chevy II in the driveway. His Aunt Mary gave the car to Wally when she became too old to drive. He had helped her pick it out when he was seventeen. Complete with fuzzy dice hanging from the rearview mirror, the car is in perfect condition with only 36,000 miles on the odometer!



Wally grew up in Vineland, New Jersey, the only child of Walter and Anna

in 1972. While at Villanova, he was one of the founding brothers of the local social fraternity "Zeta Rho" in 1969, and served as its first president. When Zeta Rho opted to affiliate with the national fraternity Sigma Nu, Wally was given the opportunity to become a Sigma Nu brother. He gladly accepted, and remains an officer on the Board of Directors of the fraternity's alumni association. An avid Villanova sports fan, Wally had the good fortune to attend the 1985 NCAA Basketball Final Four in Lexington, Kentucky where Villanova won the national championship.

Upon graduating from Villanova, Wally's first job was that of Surveyor



utility and industrial generators. Prior to his retirement after thirty years with the company, Wally headed A-S-H's aftermarket sales segment.

In the 1980s Wally started and operated an independent disc-jockey business named "At The Hop Productions". He was able to utilize his extensive record collection of three thousand 45s and hundreds of albums, spinning

tunes for weddings, parties and corporate events.

Since retiring from A-S-H, Wally continues to work part-time at the Malvern Retreat House, the largest Catholic retreat center in the country, as a Hospitality Coordinator and Sacristan. When elderly nuns come to the center for retreats, Wally enjoys driving them around in golf carts to view the grounds.



Wally met his wife of 42 years, Silvana, at a Villanova mixer during his junior year of college. Their first date was a Sha Na Na concert at West Chester University, where Silvana was a French major. After Silvana's graduation in 1973, they married in St. Patrick's Church in Malvern. They have two grown sons, Wally and Jeffrey, both of whom reside locally. After serving in the Coast Guard, their older son Wally earned a Bachelor's degree in information systems and has

worked for federal government defense contractors. He and his wife Kris own Hart's Hair Design in West Chester.

Younger son Jeff followed his dad's love of music and earned a Bachelor of Music Education degree from Duquesne University and a Master of Jazz Performance from the University of Toledo. In addition to being a high school band director, Jeff performs regularly with the Pennsylvania Symphonic Winds, Chester County Pops, the Blackbird Society Orchestra, and, of course, his dad's rock & roll band Webb. Silvana and Wally enjoy attending Jeff's concerts.

Music has always been at the top of Wally's interest list. He started with piano and voice lessons when he was about seven years old, and is self-taught on the accordion. He took up the harmonica in recent years and plans to take guitar lessons. His favorite oldies song is "Here Am I, Broken Hearted" by the Four J's from 1964. Counted

among his favorite recording artists are Buddy Holly, The Duprees, Jimmy Buffet, The Beach Boys, Billy Joel, Bobby Darin, and Frank Sinatra. In addition to the oldies he enjoys all kinds of music from Al Jolson to the Mumpers!

I asked Wally how his band Webb got started. He explained that in the fall of 1971, six Villanova University fraternity brothers came together to play popular music of the day. "Webb" quickly

became the house band for Zeta Rho parties and a mainstay on the college mixer circuit in the Philadelphia area. By 1974, graduation, careers and family commitments sent the band members on separate paths. However, they remained close friends.

At Wally's son's wedding in 2005, three of the original Webb members decided to rekindle their passion for the music of their youth. As Wally

I am so excited to tell you about Malvern Buttery located in the charming town of Malvern. How fortunate is it to have this innovative café be a part of its hometown atmosphere. The Malvern Buttery exudes welcomeness, warmth, comfort and a homelike feeling. There is even a section with comfy chairs and sofas as an eating area; or just a place to read, use your laptop, or meet a friend. The owners hope it can be a gathering place for the community.

The involved owners are John Rhoads and his vivacious wife Silenia; and you can find them there every day. John Rhoads has an entrepreneurial spirit and found himself working in a sustainable food and agriculture environment. This became his inspiration for The Malvern Buttery. Both his wife and he have a strong sense of community and Malvern does as well, so it is a perfect marriage.

They want to contribute to the livable atmosphere of Malvern. Both Silenia and John have such infectious enthusiasm and a sense of altruism and hope to make The Malvern Buttery a place “where everyone knows your name.”

You will find there is no menu, but instead a long serving table chock full of imaginative fare. The serving

table was influenced by a little town in England’s Cotswold’s. You choose the food you see as well as whetting your appetite at the same time. The food is prepared by professional chef Kevin La Forest, formerly of Avalon in West Chester. The baker is Jerome Sheehan; and sometimes John puts his baker skills to work as well. Both the chef and baker have put their heart and soul into this enterprise because it allows them such creative freedom.

The Rhoads, chef and baker – as well as other staff – consider food to be an art



in the way it is prepared and the way it is presented. And it truly is when you view the long table with fresh, colorful vegetable and fruit dishes, entrées that beg to be eaten, breads that are baked the “old world” way, innovative sandwiches, and at the end of the table sweets that are irresistible. Only fresh ingredients are used. Nothing is pre-prepared.

Malvern Buttery Oatmeal

This recipe is an example of the creative and inventive use of ingredients by Malvern Buttery staff.

- 3 cups thick rolled oats
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- Dried fruit, usually cherries & currants
- 3 tablespoons flax seeds
- Pinch of salt
- Splash of lemon juice
- 1½ quarts of milk
- 1 cup heavy cream
- 2 cups water
- ¼ cup honey
- 3 ounces unsalted butter

Stir all ingredients well and simmer until done. Serves 4.

The first time a friend and I were there, I noticed how yellow the butter was. My curiosity kicked in and I asked Mr. Rhoads why it was so yellow. He replied that it is because the cows are grass-fed and the chlorophyll turns the cream yellow. Our grandmothers had yellow butter, as I recall, before the days of additives and genetically altered food. Attention to butter meant to me that there is attention to how every food is grown, selected, and prepared; as well as what the animals are fed. It is organic, pastoral, and local.

You will be greeted at the door, welcomed, and asked what beverage you want. Then turn left and go to the beginning of the long table, pick up what looks like a wooden cutting board, utensils and napkins, and you are on your way to a healthy and delicious meal. We are having fun!

The selections are always changing. The day Jack and I were there the long table offered bean soup with beets, carrots and other greens chopped finely; focaccia with dried apricots; chicken liver mousse with beet gelee and crostini; fried gnocchi in homemade bolognese sauce; chicken salad with jicama, herbs and crostini; fruit salad with hazelnuts; pickled beets and cabbage salad; among others. You can eat all the homemade bread you want with house made peanut butter and jams and jellies. As an aside, two little girls were sitting in children’s chairs, reading provided books and munching away on their sandwiches.

Sweets are available all day. The scones are prepared the old-fashioned way and filled with fruit; there are chocolate chip cookies the Malvern Buttery way; flourless chocolate cake; and croissants and sticky buns. Some favorites are the sticky buns, cabbage salad with beets, focaccia tomato pie, scones, and chocolate croissants.

Tuesday through Friday breakfast is served from 7am to 10:30am with a variety of foods including egg dishes, frittatas, quiche and oatmeal. Lunch is available from 11:30am to 2:30pm, and goodies served from 2:30pm to 6:30pm. Saturdays are from 7:30am to 6:30pm, and Sundays are from 7:30am to 4pm. They are closed on Mondays. Special coffee is served on all days.

The Malvern Buttery is located in the Eastside Flats on King Street and parking is located just across the street.

You won’t want to miss this unique experience; not the food or the festive garden flowers. We loved it. Three cheers to the Rhoads.

As I suspected, the roll-out of Windows 10 has not gone smoothly. Some of you that were early adopters have taken the plunge and have had serious operational problems. A few of you, however, have been successful. At this time I still **do not** recommend to attempt this upgrade until Microsoft has solved these new release problems. In the meantime, click the white 4-pane-icon

If you are an early Windows 10 user and have upgraded successfully here are some things you should do. First is to make Internet Explorer your default browser. When you upgrade, Windows will use the new Edge browser as the default; not Internet Explorer. I feel Edge (shown as a stylized blue "E" on the Taskbar) is not ready for prime time. Basically, it has trouble displaying many web pages probably due to web site developers not making their

near the clock, then click View Report. This report will tell you if your computer is compatible with Windows 10. Remember this free upgrade is only for Windows 7 & 8 computers. The choice for Windows XP users is to purchase a new computer. It's time to say goodbye to XP. Vista users still receive updates from Microsoft so you can continue with this version of Windows, but you should consider buying a new one within a year or less.

sites compatible with Edge. To make the change, click the 4-pane white icon in the lower left corner (or press the 4-pane Windows key on the keyboard), click Settings, then click System in the upper left corner of the window. Near the bottom of the list on the left side, click Default Apps. Scroll down the list to Web browser. Click Microsoft Edge, then click Internet Explorer. Close the window.

If you don't see the familiar Internet Explorer icon (another stylized blue "E" but including a gold band) on either the Taskbar or the Desktop, do the following: press the Windows key or click the 4-pane-icon in the lower left corner, then click All Apps. Scroll down to Windows Accessories and click it. Move the mouse pointer to Internet Explorer, then hold down the left

click it, then click Pin to Taskbar. This technique can be used for other programs listed in the All Apps listing. If you are a Google Chrome or a Firefox user you can employ the same method after downloading and installing these applications. You probably will have to re-install your printer software. The best approach to this is to download a fresh copy from your printer manufacturer's web site. Other programs that didn't carry over to Windows 10 will also have to be re-installed.

Shutting down the Windows 10 computer is easy. Click the 4-pane white icon in the lower left corner, then click Power and click Shut Down.

Windows 10 is much improved over Windows 8, and somewhat improved over Windows 8.1. For a very quick overview, click the Get Started tile. There's much to learn about Windows 10. The best way to learn is by your own experimentation, but you can also learn some of the finer points and get answers to your questions by attending the PC Club meetings. In one of the bigger upsets in Olympic history, Horace Ashenfelter of Collegeville won the 3,000-meter steeplechase in the 1952 Olympic Games in Helsinki, Finland.

“To tell the truth, at the time I don’t believe that my coaches felt that I could win,” Ashenfelter said in an interview in 1999 when he was 76. But win he did, becoming the first American to conquer the steeplechase and in a record time of 8 minutes, 45.4 seconds.

In 1952, Ashenfelter was 29 and working as an FBI agent out of the bureau’s office in Newark, N.J. He was married to the former Lillian Wright, who also was from the Collegeville area. The couple had two sons; they would later have two more.

Ashenfelter’s running career began while he was a student at Collegeville-Trappe High School and continued when he enrolled as a freshman at Pennsylvania State University where he studied horticulture. But after one year, he dropped out of college and enlisted in the Army Air Force. He served for three years as a pilot before returning to Penn State. This time he enrolled in the aeronautical engineering course and resumed his competitive running. He changed his major to education and graduated in 1949, the same year he was the NCAA’s 2-mile champion.

After graduation, he continued to run in the American Amateur Union (AAU)

circuit, representing the Pennsylvania Athletic Club. In 1950, he became the national AAU 10,000-meter champion. In 1951, the same year he joined the FBI, Ashenfelter was the 3,000-meter steeplechase champion.

During tryouts for the 1952 Olympic team, he qualified in both the 10,000-meter and the 3,000-meter steeplechase. His brother Bill, also a Penn



State graduate, qualified for the steeplechase on the same team.

At the time, Ashenfelter said, he was in the best condition of his racing life, having done intense workouts with the team in Princeton and several weeks in Helsinki. “A few days before the race, my husband said he was going to win,” said Lillian Ashenfelter.

“I had run the steeplechase a number of times in the past, so I knew what to

expect,” said Horace Ashenfelter, whose nickname is Nip. “I never had any bad luck in my running and I felt confident. So I ran my usual race.”

The steeplechase features a number of hurdles placed over water jumps in the course of its 3,000 meters. Ashenfelter said he believed that he had to go all out when he approached those jumps. The race got under way before a reported crowd of about 70,000; mostly Finns.

“At this stage of the race, I was feeling good, so I sprinted forward, took the lead and won the race,” said Ashenfelter. Wife Lillian, 75, an Ursinus College graduate who is now a retired teacher, recalled the last seconds of the race. “When Nip took the lead, the entire stadium exploded in a loud chant of ‘Ashenfelter! Ashenfelter!’” she said.

Horace and Lillian Ashenfelter returned to the United States and were

The 1952 Olympics as Ashenfelter raced ahead of Kazantsev to win the gold medal.

About 47 years later, Ashenfelter recalled that he quickly took the lead on the inside of the track, with the Russian Vladimir Kazantsev close behind on his outside shoulder. “We were so close that he kept hitting me in my arm with his hand,” Ashenfelter remembered. At the water jumps, both runners cleared the hurdle without a problem, but Kazantsev was forced out wider in making his jump. That and the fact that he was running on the inside meant that the Russian was running a longer distance on the outside during most of the race. At the last water jump, the Russian surged a few feet into the lead, but he had just about spent his energy.



treated to a hometown parade in Collegeville. Then-Lt. Gov. Lloyd Wood was the main speaker. Ashenfelter won the AAU’s Sullivan Award as outstanding athlete of the year and received a congratulatory telegram from FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover.

Ashenfelter continued to run through 1957. He was a member of the U.S. Olympic team that went to Australia in 1956, but did not win any medals. In 1959, he left the FBI and went into the precious-metals business, from which he retired in 1993.

Despite all the personal honors, Ashenfelter said he felt great pride in being a member of the 1952 U.S. Olympic team. “It was the last truly amateur team that this country fielded,” he said.

Ashenfelter is still alive at 92 years of age and living in Phoenixville, PA.

RECIPES

A typical autumn evening in Rome is well served by *una cena semplice* (a simple meal). Our menu — along with a dry, fruity Italian wine and *frutta fresca di stagione* (seasonal fresh fruit) (persimmons recommended) for dessert — is also a lovely way to serve six during autumn in Hershey's Mill. *Mangiamo!*

Tagliatelle all'Aloro

Tagliatelle pasta with bay leaves.

- ½ cup + 3 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 1 slice onion, ¼" thick
- ¾ pound small shelled peas
- ½ teaspoon sea salt
- ¼ teaspoon freshly ground pepper
- 3 cloves garlic, crushed
- ½ teaspoon red pepper flakes
- 5 bay leaves (*fresh preferred*)
- 1½ pounds fresh tagliatelle
- 1 tablespoon dried oregano
- Parmesan cheese

In saucepan, melt 1 tablespoon of the butter; then add onion, peas, salt and pepper and cook over low heat, stirring occasionally, until tender (~15 mins.). Add remaining butter, garlic, pepper flakes, and bay leaves, and remove onion; baste ingredients with butter for 5 minutes, then move off heat. Bring 6 quarts salted water to a boil; then cook pasta until very al dente. Mix the pasta, oregano, and sauce well; and serve with freshly grated Parmesan.

Straccetti Genovesi

Sautéed veal scaloppine with lemon juice. Veal should be cut across the grain.

- 1½ pounds top round veal, sliced thin
- 3 tablespoons unsalted butter
- ¼ cup olive oil
- 1 bay leaf

- 1 clove garlic, crushed
- 2 tablespoons fresh lemon juice
- Salt and black pepper

Pound veal until very thin, cutting into pieces as needed. In a heavy skillet, heat butter and oil with bay leaf and garlic. Increase heat to moderately high, and in batches, brown meat rapidly on both sides (~1 min.). Add juice to pan and scrape to incorporate fond; remove garlic and bay leaf, season to taste, pour over meat and serve immediately.

Spinaci all Romana

Spinach with raisins and pine nuts.

- ½ cup seedless dark raisins
- 3 pounds loose fresh spinach
- 4 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 2 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil
- 1 clove garlic, crushed
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ½ cup pine nuts

Soak raisins in warm water for 10 minutes. Remove tough spinach stalks, wash and drain lightly. Cook leaves, in clinging water, in covered saucepan on moderate heat until leaves are tender (~10 mins.); drain well. Heat butter, oil and garlic in skillet; when garlic browns discard it. Add spinach, salt, nuts, and raisins; cook uncovered, stirring occasionally for 5 minutes. Serve hot.
