Master Association Board of Directors

The Master Association Budget is the largest line item in Village budgets, so this article is intended to help Hershey's Mill residents understand what is behind the Master Association numbers. What does the \$142.20 per month cover?

There are two items where a direct comparison can be made to what others in

Grounds Maintenance, especially the landscaping, sets us apart from other active-adult communities; and is one of the key features that new residents identify as a reason they selected Hershey's Mill.

Amenities include facilities, sports venues and buildings that are here for the use and enjoyment of all residents; and again the mix sets us apart from our competition.

Understanding the Master Association Budget



the immediate area pay for comparable service; Cable and Sewer. In both cases, HM rates are at least half of what other local residents pay for similar service in the area.

Buildings and Reserves is where monies are set aside for future expenditures of a capital nature. Some of the items that are reserved are: roadways, pavements and walking trails, walls, fences, barriers, buildings, and fountains.

Security for our 24/7 gated community consists largely of personnel expenses; but includes the central monitoring for fire and smoke, and the operation and maintenance of the computerized gate entry system. It also gives us the "lock and leave" capability that enables us to have worry free time when we are away for extended periods.

Administration covers the items that are listed, and is self-explanatory.

Understanding the items that are part of your Village budget is important in order to appreciate the full value we all receive for our monthly assessment. It is also important to be able to explain the Master Association Budget and the

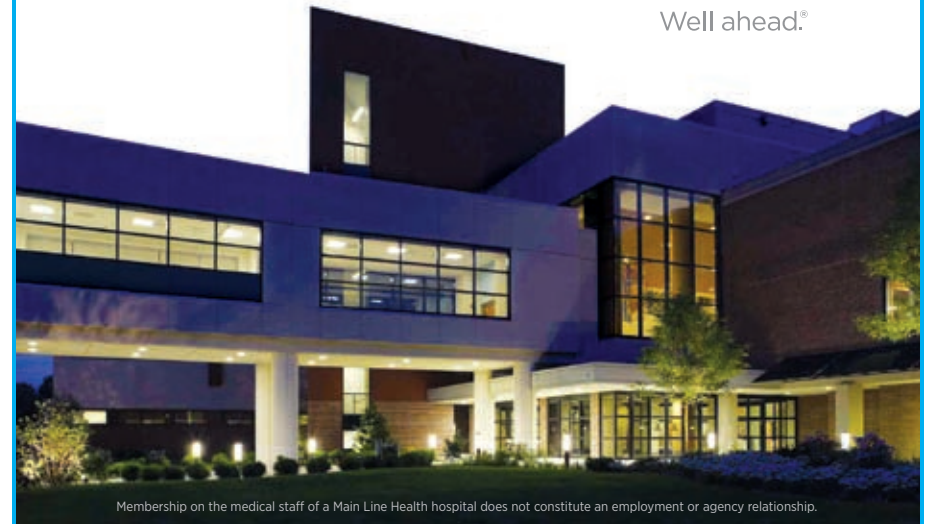

From New York City to Cuba, Panama, Connecticut, and now Hershey's Mill, Ken Barnett's life has truly been exciting and enjoyable! Ken, who has an identical twin brother Ted, was born in New York City where his parents lived in a high-rise apartment. Having no other siblings, the twins were very close. People could not tell them apart; which the twins enjoyed immensely, often fooling even their parents as to who was whom!

Meet Ken Barnett

Devonshire

As the twins started growing up, their father Jay decided that it was time to move to a nice neighborhood so that the boys could walk to school. Ken and Ted enjoyed their new neighborhood in New York where they met Robert and Roland Smith, another pair of identical twins similar in appearance and close in age to them. The four of them hung out together so often that people thought they were quadruplets! Eventually, the Barnett family moved to New Haven, Connecticut where the twins attended prep school. They had loved New York City, and after they moved to Connecticut would often return there to see Broadway shows and attend baseball games at Yankee Stadium. Their dad knew all the subway systems in New York; which added to the fun and adventure of these outings. Ken and his brother, who lives

only a few hours away, remain very close to this day. They have that special bond which many twins claim to have. Ken says that he will often go to pick up the phone to call Ted, and it will start to ring as Ted will be calling him.

Ken's dad, whom he describes as "a very bright man", met his wife, Ken's mother Phyllis McKay, while they were both working in London. Phyllis, who was born in London, was of Scottish descent. Ken's father was an executive in an investment firm. He had grown up in a Spanish-speaking neighborhood in New York City, and thus was fluent in the Spanish language. After

World War I he became interested in oil exploration in South America and Cuba.

After Ken finished prep school, his father decided to move the family to Cuba where he could pursue a career in the oil business. His dad, Ken explains, always liked to surprise people, so he said to his family "We're moving to Cuba!" The family was thrilled to seize this opportunity to immerse themselves in the Cuban culture!

The family lived in Havana for four years. I asked Ken what it was like living there and he said that it was a fascinating place to live! Life in Cuba, for the Barnetts, was very nice! Ken explained that at that time the Cubans liked Americans, and were very friendly and

welcoming. They lived in a beautiful home with servants and a chauffeur-driven limousine at their disposal. There were a lot of things to do in Havana, and it was easy to get around. While the future President of Cuba, Fidel Castro, was studying law at the University of Havana, Ken and his brother were attending the same school learning Spanish. They lived so close to the University that they could walk to school. With their teachers speaking only Spanish, Ken picked up the language very quickly. The Cubans were,

Havana. While in central Cuba, Ken saw exotic sea life, parrots, and many other beautiful birds. He even saw a large bug that could jump two feet off the ground! The food in Cuba was delicious; especially the beef, which he describes



as Ken puts it, "crazy drivers", so the family either travelled in their limousine or rode the local trollies, called "wa-wa"s, to move around town. Ken's mother became involved with a group of British women living in Havana and "had a ball" with various activities. The University of Havana had many extra-curricular activities such as first-run movies and a swim club which Ken and Ted enjoyed. Ken had great respect and admiration for the Cubans and made many friends while living there.

While in Cuba, Ken was able to travel to central Cuba, an hour and a half drive from Havana. He described this rural area as "paradise", very different from

as "superb". There was always an abundance of fresh, delicious vegetables and fruit available to eat, such as bananas, oranges and peaches.

In Havana, there were many open-air clubs with dancing and music provided by Spanish bands. Ken remembers singing and dancing and seeing all the smiling faces in the clubs where the drinks only cost forty cents! It was on one of his outings to a local club that he

met his future wife, Martha White, who was born in Panama. Her father, who was from the United States, worked for the United Fruit Company. Like Ken's father, he spoke fluent Spanish. When Ken met Martha, who was just starting college, it was love at first sight! He told her "You're a cute girl. I think I'm going to marry you." She said "You're crazy, but you're kind of cute!" Ken felt that she was "the one", and a few years later they were married in Panama.

In the years before Castro came to power, the Cuban republic saw signifi-

Castro came to power, Ken's father, possibly sensing that something was going to change, announced to his family that it was time to go. They had a wonderful time in Cuba and they all cried when they left. As Ken puts it "Cuba was one fun place!"

Upon returning from Cuba, Ken and his brother attended Yale University. They had earned college credits from their Spanish classes at the University of Havana which they applied to their Yale credits. After graduating from Yale, Ken and his brother split up for the first time. Ken joined



cant economic development but also political corruption and a succession of despotic rulers. This culminated in the overthrow of the dictator Fulgencio Batista by the 26th of July Movement; led by Fidel and Raul Castro. During this time of political upheaval when many illegal activities were being introduced in Cuba, Ken's dad was discovering oil in the country. After four years in Cuba, shortly before

the Air Force, working as an air traffic controller and studying weather patterns in Connecticut for two years. His brother joined the army and was stationed in New York. Because it was peace-time, they didn't have to leave the country.

When Ken decided to propose to Martha he flew to Panama, where she was still living. His dad, who was to be his

best man, said that he had to do this on his own. He remembers leaving Idelwilde airport (now JFK) and flying down to Panama alone; which he remembers as a very exciting trip! Martha, of course, said yes and they were later married overlooking the Panama Canal. He loved the experience

Up Close with Ken

How long have you lived at Hershey's Mill? Ten years.

What activities are you involved with at Hershey's Mill? I enjoy walking around the grounds at Hershey's Mill. Since I don't drive anymore, my generous friend and neighbor Sandy Wollenberg drives me to activities, doctor's appointments, etc. She recently took me to the casual singing group which I enjoyed very much!

How many children and grandchildren do you have? I have four children (3 girls and a boy) and ten grandchildren (5 girls and 5 boys). My fifth great-grandchild was just born recently!

How did you come to live at Hershey's Mill? Having lived in Valley Forge for many years, I was aware when Hershey's Mill was being built. When it was time to downsize, my son-in-law (who is a real estate lawyer) suggested Hershey's Mill. My wife Martha, who passed away four years ago, was ill at the time and we needed a wheelchair-accessible home. The house in Devon was perfect because it was all on one floor; and with two children living nearby, we loved the location!

Favorite places to travel? Panama, Cuba and the islands of the Caribbean.

of traveling through the Panama Canal, and marvels at how it was dug by men under difficult conditions in terribly humid weather. Many men died during it's construction. Ken feels that seeing the Panama Canal is something that everyone who can should experience. His son was able to see it and loved the experience. Ken will always remember swimming in the Atlantic Ocean in the morning, and later that same day, swimming in the Pacific!

After his Air Force experience, Ken earned an MBA degree from the Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania through the GI Bill. With his MBA, Ken had many job offers.

years of his career he had his own business; retiring when his wife became ill so that he could spend more time with her. He is still close to his twin brother and talks to him often. Ted's wife, like Ken's, had cancer and passed away a few years ago. His brother has since remarried. Ken keeps in touch with his large family; including his children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren, visiting them often. He is grateful for the time he spent in Cuba and Panama. As he puts it, "It was a great experience. I have no regrets." He loves living at Hershey's Mill, and although he misses Martha he treasures the time that they had together here; "just the two of them."

Have you ever driven past something a hundred times and never paid much attention to it, even missing the sign? Well, in this case I had. The only thing I ever remembered about it is that it looked like an old



Dairy Queen; and yes, that's what it was – right near here on Lancaster Pike.

A friend mentioned it to me a while ago, and suggested this might be a good place to visit and write about. Indeed she was correct. Before I even get started, I can say it was one of the best dinners Jack and I have had since I have been writing the Dining Out section in the *Guide and Digest*.

It has been owned for 24 years by the same family, and the husband is the chef. With about 14 tables, he does it with just one sous chef. The restaurant is named for his wife Bunha and first daughter Faun. The chef goes by the name Danai K. He is Thai, and his last name is Krzemieniewa; too much for us English speaking people! But in any language, the food is exceptional.

The cuisine is French-Asian fusion. I have heard the word fusion so many

times and usually just pretend like I know what it means. Well, this time I asked. Most of the sauces are made with some alcohol – consequently “fusion” infused with alcohol.

The atmosphere is calming, with linen tablecloths and napkins. Each table is lighted with one candle and a small flower arrangement. Lovely for an intimate dinner, but also an enticing place to have dinner with friends. There are only two servers, but they were most attentive

despite a filled restaurant when we were there. Our water glasses were never empty. Another plus for Bunha Faun is that it is a BYOB. No corkage charge either.

The presentation of food calls out for consumption; it is that appealing. And the food is piping hot. Dinner is the only meal served with a number of specials. If you are a vegetarian (who still eats fish), you have found the place; fish dishes are plentiful, as well as tofu. Our evening's specials were: cream of coconut pumpkin corn soup; and sautéed oysters on a bed of spinach with cream

of vermouth sauce and asparagus salad. Entrées were: steamed salmon topped with crabmeat and vermouth sauce (now I was beginning to understand “fusion”); baked rainbow trout stuffed with sun-dried tomatoes, mushrooms and spinach with a red burgundy sauce; sautéed Barramundi with scallion ginger sauce; and sautéed shrimp and scallops with artichoke hearts and mushrooms in a champagne cream sauce.

Even though desserts are my favorite, I have been trying to avoid them lately. But you guess correctly that it was too tempting this time. Crème brulee was recommended, but Jack chose tiramisu cake with a generous amount of mascarpone cheese (which one rarely finds these days – the cheese, that is) and crème anglaise. There was also cappuccino truffle (*yum yum*), triple chocolate

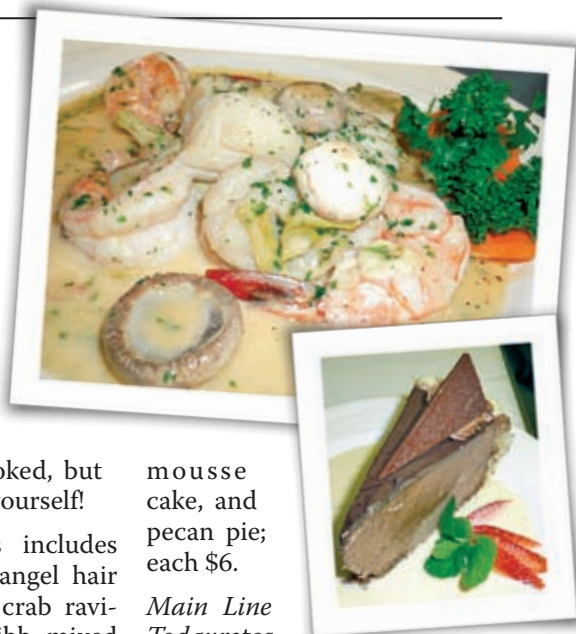

All entrées were accompanied with scalloped potatoes, which were creamier than the dish I know, and green beans like nothing I have ever experienced. I could have just had a plate of those two sides. I know the magic way they are cooked, but you will have to inquire for yourself!

A sampling of appetizers includes French onion soup, green angel hair pasta, escargot, as well as crab ravioli. Salads include Caesar, bibb, mixed greens, and snow peas – all complemented appropriately.

In addition to the entrées mentioned above, you can enjoy: roast duckling (de-boned) wrapped with bacon; tofu curry with sweet peppers and eggplant; rack of lamb baked with herbs (a large portion – eight ribs!); filet mignon wrapped with bacon in red wine sauce; and *escalop* of chicken sautéed with apricot and ginger in white wine sauce.

Now when we pass by, I will know that there is exceptional dining inside. Not “a curl on top.” *Bon Appétit!*

In the northeast United States, golf course maintenance work is highly visible to the golfing public between the months of April and October. Observing daily mowing, watering, fertilizing, chemical applications, and so many other specific maintenance practices is commonplace to golfers as they make their way around the facility. I cannot think of another recreational activity

As the golf season transitions into the winter months, our maintenance crew is downsized to half of its normal operation of fourteen. In that capacity, the crew continues to regularly mow all of the playing surfaces into the month of December; for continued course play, and to prevent the bentgrass surfaces from thatching up. As the thousands of trees on the property drop their leaves over the span of several weeks, the crew feverishly mulches, blows, and eventually removes all of them. Left unattended, rotten leaves smother

Why Golf Course Maintenance in the Winter?



or sport where the maintenance operation is continuously operating on the same grounds which the partaker of the activity is using. Can you imagine watching a football game while the maintenance crew is out there trying to mow the field?

Where our summer golf maintenance operation is under constant watch by the golfing membership, our winter operation is not so casually observed – even though it is just as busy and productive. I am constantly asked as to what our maintenance crew is actually doing over the winter months at Hershey's Mill.

turf grass and would leave the golf course in unplayable condition for the next season. The foliage of the seasonal landscape plants and grasses throughout the property are cut down and removed to promote healthy growth for the next season. All of the ball washers, tee markers, tee tins, hazard stakes, bunker rakes, etc. are brought back into the maintenance shop to be repainted/refurbished by our own crew. Did you know our ball washers are approaching 20 years in age, yet they look brand new at the beginning of each golf season?

One of the most critical winter jobs that must take place on the course is the winterization of the miles of underground irrigation pipe and the 1,000+ sprinkler heads on the property. The

Golf Tip

If these days Mother Nature is limiting our practice to just indoor putting, take advantage of that time and work on your stroke. Whatever your style of grip, stance, and stroke may be, always make sure the putter head is square to your target line at and through the

ball. It is extremely important that you avoid the collapse of your left wrist through impact. Being a good putter means having sound fundamentals, good judgement, and confidence. Once you master the first two, the last one will quickly follow.

golf irrigation system is isolated from the water source at the pump station, drained, and each sprinkler is blown out with compressed air. The entire process takes over two weeks to complete.

Drainage projects, dead tree removal, sign repair, irrigation repair, and restoration projects take place every winter at Hershey's Mill. Additionally, the crew has been heavily involved with the larger scale bunker restoration projects that have taken place at our club over the past few years. The full involvement of the Hershey's Mill maintenance crew, working along with the contracted golf course construction firm, has kept the cost of these projects reasonable and the job timeline shorter.

When work cannot be completed out on the course, the work is moved behind closed doors at the maintenance facility. Along with painting and refurbishing, the 60 plus machines and carts that are used on the course are being cleaned, repaired, and serviced; blades are being sharpened, sprayers winterized, and new golf accessories are being assembled. The assistant and the golf course superintendent use the winter months to forecast the materials to be applied for the next golf season. Roughly

90% of the fungicides, herbicides, insecticides, growth retardants, and fertilizers are purchased over the winter to take advantage of winter promotions that are run by companies such as BASF and Bayer. The purchase of these products "off season" results in close to a 10% savings on a six-figure line-item. With well over 100 product applications needed to be made on the course during the golf season, forecasting the chemistry and specific amount of products to use is a painstaking process.

And then there is the snow! The golf maintenance department at Hershey's Mill is a major contributor to the snow removal operation that takes place within the Hershey's Mill community. Four of the snow plow operators on site are from the golf maintenance crew, while the rest of the employees shovel and salt many of the communities, the club house, the paddle tennis courts, and occasionally the shopping center. After the snow removal and de-icing responsibilities are complete, the assistant and the golf course superintendent carefully monitor the ice situation on the 20 golf greens out on the course. If it is determined that the winter ice is inhibiting the dormant turf's respiration process, the entire maintenance crew will walk out to the critical greens and remove the ice manually.

Finally, the winter golf season is a time for the golf maintenance department to enjoy the holiday season and to be with their families. While it is necessary to set up and maintain the golf course around Easter Sunday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, and Labor Day, the golf maintenance department does not work on Thanksgiving or between Christmas and the New Year ... unless there is a snow storm!

With the golf course property at Hershey's Mill taking up 100+ acres, there are countless areas that require yearly maintenance, areas that may need special attention, or areas that could be completely altered into something new. As long as we are here, you will find us working on improving your golf club, no matter what time of year it is.

Provided in this article are some common Windows keyboard shortcuts. These shortcuts allow you to control the computer via



My favorite keyboard shortcut for copying text and pasting it to another document, or to another portion of the same document, is Ctrl "C" followed by Ctrl "V". Highlight the text you want to copy, then hold the Ctrl key while you press the "C" key. This action places the highlighted text in memory, but also leaves it in place. Next, place the cursor where you want to paste the highlighted text into and hold the Ctrl key while you press the "V" key. The copy and paste keyboard shortcuts work on all versions of Windows. One other text associated keyboard

Windows Keyboard Shortcuts

a sequence of keystrokes. For example, the first Windows 10 keystroke listed is "Windows key + A" and this opens the Action Center in a window on the right side of the screen. The Action Center allows you to see what has taken place in your Windows 10 computer. The Windows key is usually located in the lower left portion of the keyboard, and is defined by a 4-segment white or black insignia. Instructions to implement this keyboard shortcut (and others similarly) is to hold down the Windows key and simultaneously press the "A" key. To create a new virtual desktop screen, hold down the Windows key as well as the Ctrl key, and simultaneously press the "D" key. *Note that I have used capital letters for clarity only; you don't have to capitalize the letter keys by holding down the "shift" key.*

shortcut is Ctrl "X". To move text, highlight the text, hold down the Ctrl key while you press the "X" key and the highlighted text disappears. Place the cursor where you want it then hold down the Ctrl key while you press the "V" key to enter it at that location.

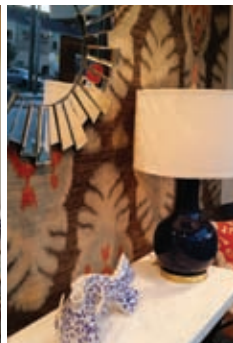

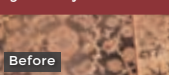

During the 19th century, when congregational singing was an integral part of church worship, singing schools played a major role in enhancing sacred music.

“The most important effect of singing schools was the development of musically literate people,” Ruth Shaffer wrote in *The Historical Review of Berks County* (Winter 1996-97 edition). According to Shaffer, singing schools were developed in New England in the 18th century to improve the quality of hymn singing among parishioners. Such schools took root in our region at the beginning of the 19th century, particularly among the German-speaking people in rural communities.

At this time, churches took the lead in organizing singing schools. Qualified teachers were hard to find, and there were very few song books published either in English or German.

Using a tuning fork in order to get the proper pitch, small classes would meet in schoolhouses, churches, or even inns and taverns to learn how to sing church music properly. At first, the

teacher would break the class down into smaller groups of tenors, basses, altos and sopranos. Instruction would be given to each of the groups, and then they would come together for a class sing.

Singing Schools

Historian Sylvester H. Orr, writing in *Sketches of the Historical Society of Montgomery County*, noted that such schools existed in Berks, Bucks, Chester and Montgomery Counties during the first half of the 19th century. “Many graduates of these singing schools went on to become choir leaders,” Orr said.

The courses in such singing schools usually lasted for 12 lessons, and the group was charged about \$18 to \$20. When these lessons were completed, the music teacher moved on to the next farming village and a new class.

The law that created public schools in Pennsylvania in 1834 increased the popularity of singing schools among German-speaking religious groups such as the Lutheran and Reformed Churches. Public schools were seen by the German communities as a threat to their cultural identity. Thus demand developed for a higher quality of singing schools among German-speaking

to read music and the basics of singing, harmony and meter. And the focus was still sacred music. Some of these classes might have had 75 or more students, Shaffer said.

Toward the end of the century, the nature of the singing schools changed. While there remained a core of church music, more popular singing was being introduced. Recreational singing began to rival “musical self-improvement” within the various singing schools. “At this time, no social gathering would be complete without a group sing-along,” Shaffer wrote.

Larger classes, which included both children and adults, were held. And teachers were paid a higher group rate of up to \$25. Students were taught how

Urbanization began to make its impact in the rural areas of our region, and there was a marked decline in the German language both in the schools and the churches. And while a few singing schools remained into the 20th century, the beginning of that century brought a sharp decline.

Winter is staring us straight in the eyes, and only the warm and steamy comfort of a casserole can provide solace. Our recipes are a complete meal in a dish; each easy to make, full of flavor, and they can travel well to friends and family. Each makes about 6 servings, and they reheat well or can be scaled to feed a crowd. Casserole dish size is flexible, with wider dishes generally providing more crispness and deeper more moistness. So show winter who's the boss by warming up the kitchen, the taste buds, and the heart.

Cincinnati Sour Cream

Midwestern folks know pork and potatoes, and it's too cold there not to smother them in cream. Peel potatoes for a less rustic dish, and for a hint of sweetness, add a layer of tart apples.

3 tablespoons vegetable oil
6 pork cutlets (pound lightly if thick)
3 russet potatoes, skin on, thinly sliced
2 red onions, thinly sliced
½ teaspoon caraway seeds
1 teaspoon ground sage
1½ teaspoons kosher salt
1 teaspoon black pepper
1½ cups sour cream (*not* lowfat)

Preheat oven to 350°F. Heat oil in skillet and brown cutlets on both sides. Grease a ~2½-quart casserole dish, layer ½ the potatoes and onions, and sprinkle half the seasonings. Layer in cutlets, and repeat above. Spread cream evenly on top, cover dish, and bake for 40 minutes until glazed.

The Great Northern

Hearty lamb and beans are a gastronomic delight.

2 15.5 oz cans white beans
¼ cup minced fresh parsley
¼ cup olive oil
2 pounds lamb, cut into 1½" cubes

1 onion, chopped
2 celery ribs, chopped
1 carrot, chopped
3 cloves garlic, minced
1½ teaspoons minced fresh rosemary
1 teaspoon ground sage
1½ teaspoons kosher salt
1 teaspoon black pepper
1 cup white wine
1 stick unsalted butter
3 tablespoons wholewheat flour
2 cups milk (*not* skim)
1 tablespoon cider vinegar
¾ cup bread crumbs

Layer the drained beans and parsley in a ~2½-quart greased casserole dish. Heat oil in skillet, and cook lamb, vegetables, herbs, and seasonings until browned. Add wine, cover, and simmer until lamb is tender (~1 hour); then spoon over beans.

Preheat oven to 350°F. In hot saucepan, melt 3 tablespoons butter, then whisk in flour for 2 minutes; add milk and whisk until it boils, then reduce heat and stir until it thickens; add vinegar, and pour evenly over lamb mixture. Melt remaining butter, combine with bread crumbs, and

evenly distribute them over the casserole. Bake, uncovered, until lightly browned (~30 minutes).

Sticky Vegetarian

A gooey sweet potato dish to make a whole meal ... or the greatest accompaniment this side of dessert!

6 medium sweet potatoes, peeled and thinly sliced
2 tablespoons dark rum
½ cup sugar
½ cup firmly packed dark brown sugar
½ teaspoon ground cinnamon
½ teaspoon ground cloves
¾ teaspoon kosher salt
¼ cup vegetable oil

The Comfort of the Casserole

Preheat oven to 325°F. Grease a ~2-quart casserole dish, and arrange potatoes in overlapping layers. In a saucepan with 1 cup of water, add remaining ingredients and bring to a boil, then reduce to low and stir for 4 minutes. Pour over potatoes, cover, and bake until potatoes

are tender (~45 minutes); basting as needed. Uncover and let set for 10 minutes before serving for glaze to set.

Low Country Piloo

Y'all gonna just love this yummy chicken, shrimp and rice dish. Great for using up leftover chicken and rice too.

1 cup brown rice & 1 teaspoon salt
½ stick unsalted butter
1 onion, chopped
1 celery rib, chopped
2 cups fresh mushrooms, chopped
¼ cup wholewheat flour
1 cup chicken broth
1 cup half-and-half cream
3 cups cubed cooked chicken

1 cup
chopped
cooked
shrimp
½ cup sliced

almonds
2 ounces pimentos,
chopped

1 tablespoon dry sherry
1½ teaspoons kosher salt
1 teaspoon black pepper

Bring 2½ cups water to a boil; add rice and salt, cover, reduce heat and simmer until water is absorbed (~40 mins). Preheat oven to 350°F. In skillet, melt butter, then stir vegetables for 5 minutes over medium heat; add flour and stir 3 more minutes; add broth and cream and stir until thickened. Mix rice, vegetables, and all remaining ingredients in a greased ~2½-quart casserole dish, and bake, covered, for 30 minutes.
