

In previous articles, I have warned about various scams where people call your home and use convincing stories, "You've won a car" or "A loved one is in jail and needs you to post bail", to persuade you to reveal your bank account

eowners. The scammer will tell you that service is about to be shut off because of unpaid bills; and to avoid this, you must pay the overdue bill by providing a credit card number or pre-paid debit card number. These scammers try to confuse and deceive people by stressing the urgency of paying the bill

numbers or to wire money. Because so many people have become aware of the wire transfer schemes, scammers are now turning their attention to credit cards and pre-paid debit cards.

Especially during peak air conditioning season and winter months, scammers will pose as utility company representatives and make telephone calls to homimmediately over the phone. In some cases, they have been demanding payment for several months of purported unpaid service; and they even have the ability to falsely display the name and phone number of your utility company on Caller ID.

Once these scammers have your credit or debit card number, they will drain your account of any remaining credit or funds!

If you receive a call from a utility company threatening to cut off service, do not give any information.

Rather, dial the customer service number on your corresponding utility bill and verify the information with an actual utility company representative.

 Anyone claiming to be a loved one who is hurt; or in jail and needing money for bail or attorney fees.

> The Sheriff's Office or Police Department; regarding your jury duty absence.

Also be aware of anyone calling a n d stating you

should send money, in any form, espe-cially if they claim to be:

- The IRS; threatening unpaid taxes.

 Publisher's Clearing House; you've won a prize or cash and must pay to have it delivered.

 Microsoft; your computer has been infected or needs an update. Credit
 card com pany; claim ing your card
 has been com-

promised and asking you to provide card information.

Remember that these scammers are well trained and very convincing. So if you ever think that a telephone call may be related to a scam, simply hang up the phone.



In 2001, Jim and Judy Molt were living in Gilbertsville, PA, on six beautifullygardened acres. They loved their home, but were tired of the upkeep; and since they had become empty-nesters, they decided it was time to downsize.

They were working in the pharmaceutical industry. Jim had just started a new job in Edison, NJ, and Judy in Wilmington, DE. So, they looked for a place to live approximately halfway between their workplaces. When they found Hershey's Mill, it was perfect for them. They enjoy the maintenance-free lifestyle and the location.

They are world travelers, having been to all seven continents; and they have

Their travels have also taken them to Australia, New Zealand, India and Africa. One memorable trip was to the eastern Indian state of Assam, where they went on a safari looking for Bengal tigers. They were in a convoy of about ten jeeps traveling the countryside, and were able to get pretty close to a few tigers – which was very exciting. They also had the thrill of sailing through the Panama Canal; and visited Cuba. which was beautiful and seemed frozen in time.

On one work-related trip to Japan, Jim climbed Mount Fuji as part of a teambuilding challenge. A local told him, "He who never climbs Mt. Fuji has no heart, and he who climbs it more than once has no brain." Judy has also done her share of climbing. When she was younger, she climbed Mt. Katahdin at the end of the Appalachian Trail in Maine.

Jim was born in New Jersey and grew up in the Philadelphia suburbs; in Bala Cynwyd and Jenkintown where he went to high school. Jim spent his summers in Avalon where his father had purchased property in the 1950s.

University. Jim and Judy recently had a "small world" experience here at Hershey's Mill while having dinner at the Club. Upon being introduced by mutual friends, their "new" friend asked if Jim had gone to Bala Cynwyd Junior High School. It turned out that she was his ninth-grade Spanish teacher, Cynthia Cline (formerly Miss Orr), who lives with husband Bill in Kennett.

Judy was born in Munson, a small town in rural Massachusetts. She attended Westbrook College and the University of Connecticut. In the 1960s, her dad took a job in Phoenixville and relocated the family to Audubon. Judy got a job at Merck, and worked in the Safety Assessment



Although the

house was sold, the family still vacationed there one week in the summer to relive the "good old shore days."

Jim graduated from Colgate University with a BA in Biology, and went on to earn a PhD in physiology from Cornell

Labs. After the birth of her first child, she left the labs and secured a position in the Regulatory Affairs Division where she developed and wrote packaging inserts for products. This was the 1970s, when women were just

beginning to handle having careers and families at the same time. In this respect, she felt like a pioneer. She later worked on cardiovascular medications developing marketing and advertising; and getting drug approval. She felt she came full-circle by handling all the

steps in development, production, and distribution of the drugs. Judy ended her pharmaceutical career at Astra Zeneca as a head in Regulatory. She also mentored many young women as they developed their careers and juggled families.

After earning his PhD in physiology, Jim taught physiology at Albany Medical College in New York, and worked to obtain grants to study and treat spinal cord injuries and central nervous system trauma. He did post-doctoral work at Hahnemann University Hospital in Philadelphia as an assistant professor.

Jim heard that Merck was looking for scientists in the Regulatory Affairs Department to interact with the FDA to get new drugs approved. He was hired, and worked at Merck for eleven years; helping to get Prilosec and Nexium approved. He also worked at Rhone Poulenc Rorer and was instrumental in developing Ryluzole, a drug used to treat ALS (Lou

Gherig's Disease).

Judy and Jim met when they were working at Merck. They are both retired now, but Jim still does some consulting. They continue to travel actively, and spend summer weekends sailing. Judy spends most of her time juggling: caring for her elderly parents (who live in Wellington), grandchildren, volunteering with the Paoli Hospital Auxiliary (she is president of the Hershey's Mill branch), and being chairperson of Friends of Sullivan House. She was instrumental in saving Sullivan House from demolition.

When Jim was a graduate student at Colgate in the late '60s, he and friends

would watch *Jeopardy* together at lunchtime in their fraternity house. He was always able to answer many of the questions. So, in 1971 while still at Cornell, he finally got the courage to

How many children and grandchildren do you have? We have three children between us. I have a son, and Jim has a son and daughter. We have three grandsons and a step-granddaughter; all live nearby.

try out. He was able to get an interview and went down to NBC studios in New York City. He had to fill out a questionnaire about himself, and was given some sample *Jeopardy* questions and a camera test. Afterwards, the *Jeopardy* staff told him if he didn't hear back in six weeks to two months, he didn't make the cut. To his surprise, they called him the next day and told him he fit the bill; they asked him to come back for a taping of the show.

At the time, Art Fleming was the host and Don Pardo, of *Saturday Night Live* fame, was the announcer. How did he get called back so quickly? Jim reasons that there weren't many men trying out at the time; it was mostly housewives, as the men were all out working. Also, he found out later that Art Fleming had spent time at Colgate and Cornell, Jim's Alma Maters. Jim said that Don Pardo was a great guy, but Art Fleming was not very friendly.

The show was taped in the spring and aired the next fall. Not being nervous, Jim enjoyed the experience. The "host chat" with Art Fleming was all rehearsed. The buzzer was easier to work then than it is now since contestants could buzz-in before a question was finished; contestants must now wait until the answer is finished. Going into Final Jeopardy, Jim had the most money. He felt confidant because the category was State Capitols and bet a lot of money. The Final Jeopardy answer was "This state capitol has statues of Abraham Lincoln, Henry Clay and Alben Barkley." The correct question was "What is Frankfort, Kentucky?" All of the contestants answered "What is Springfield, Illinois" which was wrong. Jim had bet the most money, so he lost the game. He enjoyed the experience

though, taking home a set of *Encyclopedia International* and \$100.

Jim has always been interested in trivia. In high school, he appeared on a local Philadelphia quiz show, similar to *College Bowl*, called "It's Academic" for Jenkintown High School. He has also participated in Hershey's Mill Baby Boomers trivia games. I asked what advice he would give someone appearing on *Jeopardy* today. He said you have to study and read a lot as the questions are harder now; although many answers are logical if you know the major subject areas. His favorite categories are history, science and geography.

Jim and Judy enjoy living in Hershey's Mill. They have met many wonderful friends here, and feel that there is a great sense of community.



Well, for someone who is not that fond of Chinese food, I have dined at two Chinese/Asian restaurants within two months. While Nectar is upscale, P.F. Chang's is less formal. But I think the food was equally good. Philip Chang acquired his inspiration from his mother, Cecilia Chang, who was flourishing in the wild success of her Chinese restaurant in San Francisco. She was honored with a James Beard

Wok cooking is essential to Chinese cuisine, and originated nearly 2,000 years ago. In the wok over a flame, oil heats up in a matter of seconds causing an explosion of flavors and releasing a wok hei (not a wok "high" though similar in the taste of the food). "A wok hei can metaphorically be translated as the "breath of the wok," when a wok breathes energy, giving foods a unique concentrated flavor and aroma" says Grace Young in *The Wisdom of the Chinese Kitchen*.

Philip Chang later managed his mother's restaurant, and subsequently, a restaurateur named Paul Fleming entered his life and a partnership began for P.F. Chang's in the 1990s. The first several restaurants were opened in California, and now they can be found across the United States. While there are many restaurants now, each one prides itself

on having a "from scratch" kitchen. Attention to detail has not been ignored, and the standards are the same as those of his mother's original restaurant. Each location has chefs, not just "kitchen managers". Even the simplest details, such as julienning carrots, are done with a passion. As further example, "the pinches and folds in the dim sum must be perfect" they say.

The wok is one of the most common cooking utensils in China, and is used frequently at P.F. Chang's. A colorful array of vegetables and meats are cut precisely for wok cooking, and used along with vibrant sauces. Diners can choose what they would like to have prepared in the wok – a great way to customize with your favorites.

Chang's menu is varied and extensive. Categories are small plates, dim sum,



sushi, soups (including wonton, of course), entrée salads, main entrées, noodles and rice, and gluten-free. Surely, there's something for everyone. Five of us dined, three having the chicken satay glazed with coconut peanut sauce along with vegetable spring rolls. Another had lettuce wrap with soy beef and wok-seared sesame chicken.

Small plates have become popular in many restaurants, not surpris-



ing as we become more conscious of how much and what we are eating. Some choices of these at P.F. Chang's are crispy green beans in tempura batter; lettuce wraps with chicken or vegetables; jicama street tacos; and kale and quinoa dip with sesame-seasoned wonton chips.

Scratch-made Dim Sum examples are: hand-folded crab wontons; Saigon summer rolls; and egg or vegetable spring rolls. Five of the sushi offerings are: scallop roll, California roll, Ahi tartar with avocado, lobster avocado roll, and spicy tuna roll.

There are multiple entrées from which to select, and dishes include chicken, seafood, beef, pork, and vegetarian. You might like: crispy honey chicken; Kung Pao chicken; Oolong Chilean sea bass; walnut shrimp with melon; lobster and shrimp rice; Mongolian beef; sweet-and-sour pork; orange-peel beef; stir-fried eggplant; or coconut curry vegetables, among others.

Noodles and rice are classic Asianinspired bowls. There are an impressive number of gluten-free selections available. Also offered are "Chang's for Two" at a *prix-fixe* \$42.95 (when we were there), and with many selections.

P.F. Chang's motto could be what

they espouse: "The core of our food: all-natural meat, responsibly sourced seafood, hand-chopped veggies, and sauces made from scratch." I


think that's quite something to live-up to every day!

This month's article is a break from the recent Windows 10 topics. I will be exploring how to set up your Comcast Xfinity X1 box so you can view Channel 20. And also walking you through signing up for a service that can block unwanted robo phone calls – but only if you are a Comcast voice customer.

Comcast Xfinity X1 Box

Many of you have contacted Channel 20 saying you can't receive our channel after having Comcast install their newest Xfinity X1 box. Although we are not in a position to solve TV problems for Comcast, the fact that our own channel was not viewable deserves our attention. The problem lies in the settings of the X1 box, and manifests itself when - Press Exit.

you input "20" on the remote and end up watching the HSN channel in HD (high definition). This happens because the box settings are set to "auto tune" to a high-definition channel, and Channel 20 is a SD (standard definition) channel. The following instructions will change the X1 box to allow you to view Channel 20:

- Press the Xfinity button on the remote, and using the right arrow button, navigate to the Gear button at the far right. Press OK.
- Using the down arrow button, go to Preferences. Press OK.
- Go to General, Press OK.
- Press the down arrow button to go to the Auto Tune to HD option. Press OK to turn it off.

You can now input "20" on the remote and receive our channel. But hold on, there are other ways to get Channel 20. If you have the voice activated remote, just say "Channel 20" and it will take you there instantly. A third way to get Channel 20 is to enter "18" on the remote, then press the channel Up button twice to get to 20.



If you hear only one ring, you'll know that it was a robo call and Nomorobo is on the job.

To begin, go to https://www.nomorobo. com. Click the "Get Started Now" button to create your free account. In Step 1, under Type, choose Landline/VoIP. Under Carrier, choose Comcast/Xfinity. In Step 2, enter your email address. When you press Next, you will receive further instructions via an email sent to you. In the email message, click on "Click Here to Setup Nomorobo". Login into your account to complete the

This section only applies to those of you who have Comcast voice service along with your Comcast Internet and TV service; usually called the Triple Play. Sorry Verizon customers, you are out of luck.

This free service, called Nomorobo, will interact with your incoming phone calls and determine if they are robo calls. If they are, they will be blocked from ringing your phone more than once.

setup. You will also need to get into your Comcast Voice Preferences to add the Nomorobo phone number to divert any robo calls. If you encounter any problems, you can click Questions on the main Nomorobo screen. then click Nomorobo Setup, and then choose Comcast.

I've used Nomorobo for six months and it blocks virtually all robo calls without interfering with normal calls.

The 1897 murder of Isaac Alder, an elderly resident of Evansburg, aroused public and private concern. It appeared that the victim was tortured to make him tell where his money was hidden before he was killed.



second was for \$100 for information about the Norristown murder of James McLaughlin. Neither of these rewards was collected. Hocker notes.

It was also common during

the 19th century for private citizens to offer rewards, in addition to those offered by the government, in crimes involving murder or assault. In most cases cited by Hocker, robbery and murder were involved.

In 1862, a reward of \$500 was offered for information on the murder of Daniel Bruner, which occurred near Stony Creek in Norristown, PA. Bruner appeared to have been the victim of a sidewalk stickup. Bruner's father

Rewards as **Police Work**

> The county commissioners offered a reward of \$500. Henry K. Boyer, speaker of the state House of Representatives and a resident of Evansburg, added \$100 to the reward; and a group of neighbors put up an additional \$175. Yet there was no arrest.

> By the 20th century, with the establishment of police forces at all government levels, rewards were offered less and less often. Wrote Hocker: "Good police work rather than rewards gets results."





When I tell people that I am a PGA Golf Professional, they often ask "Have you ever played with Tiger?" Or "Is Phil really as nice as he seems?" Usually, I follow up the answer with an explanation of the difference between being a "professional golfer" and a "golf professional." The latter is certainly the less sexy of the two, but does come with its own rewards.

A professional golfer is, of course, an individual who plays golf for money by competing in professional



tournaments for cash prizes. Those are the men and women who are paid millions of dollars in prizes and endorsements to get their ball out of the bunkers and into the hole in front of the TV cameras. The PGA Golf Professional, on the other hand, is a member of the PGA of America. His or her strengths are portrayed in the many aspects of the golf industry. These include not only the actual dollars and cents of the business, but the game and people surrounding it as well. Golf professionals get their reward by helping a student

successfully get out of the bunker and into the hole just so he can win a two dollar "nassau" against his buddies.

The PGA of America, which is celebrating its 100th anniversary this year, is the largest working sports organization in the world. It is comprised of more than 28,000 men and women that establish the standards of the profession while growing the interest and participation in the game of golf. In order to be elected to membership of the PGA of America, you must first successfully navigate a difficult "roadmap".

This process has each apprentice, or student, going through three separate levels of education courses. These include semi-

women have the option to pursue this PGA education through self-study, by the use of accredited PGA Golf Management Universities, or through an accelerated PGA Golf Management Program.

An additional requirement for gaining membership is passing the PGA's Playing Ability Test. The Playing Ability Test (PAT) has evolved a bit in recent years, but is always an extremely high pressure situation. At one point in time, it was the very first step in the process of pursuing PGA membership.

Many aspiring golf professionals had to wait, in some cases for years, to first pass the PAT only to begin their grueling process to gaining membership. This is fondly referred to, but only by those who passed eventually, as being on the "PAT Tour."

The PAT is a one-day, 36-hole event, with a specific target score of within 15 strokes of the course rating. In most cases, back-to-back scores in the low to mid 70s would do it. On average, less than 10% of those attempting were

RECIPES

If you can't be in Hawaii on June 11 to celebrate King Kamehameha Day, just eat like you are! Of course, there are a few native ingredients to trip you up - the Inamona (roasted Kukui nuts), the Maui onion (Kula-grown small & sweet), Macadamia nut oil, Hawaiian sea salt, Kajiki, Sea Asparagus, and more. We've channeled the spirit of Hawaii, and used readily available ingredients to capture a similar taste right here in Hershey's Mill. Mahi Mahi (looks scary but tastes delicious) steps in for Kajiki, Macadamia nuts provide a sweet island crunch, slender seasoned asparagus handles the sea-vegetable garnish, and local early tomatoes and basil lend a fresh hand. Our recipe is for two, but we suggest you scale it and invite friends – it is so delicious and healthy that you will want to celebrate!

Macadamia & Tomato Mahi Mahi

2 5-ounce filets of Mahi Mahi

3 ounces vegetable oil

1 pint grape tomatoes

1/4 cup thinly sliced sweet onion, such as Vidalia

2 cloves garlic, very thinly sliced

1/3 cup chopped Macadamia nuts

1 tablespoon finely chopped fresh sweet basil

Sea salt and cracked pepper, to taste 8 very thin asparagus spears

Dry and season the fish, then saute (over medium high heat) in half the oil until golden (about 2-3 minutes per side); fish should be flaky but moist. Remove

fish. In the same pan, add remaining oil, then whole tomatoes, and cook about 1 minute. Add onion, garlic, nuts, and basil and stir gently until the tomatoes start to blister and some break open. Season

with salt and pepper,

and remove from the heat. Steam asparagus spears for 1 minute (they will still be quite crunchy), and season liberally with sea salt. Plate the fish, spoon the warm tomato mixture on top, and garnish with the asparagus cut to 1½ inch lengths.


