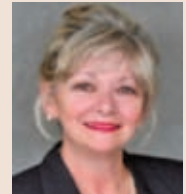

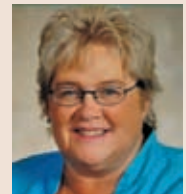

Did you know that less than four miles from Hershey's Mill, there is a free clinic, Community Volunteers in Medicine (CVIM), which provides health care and hope to people who do not have any health insurance? These people have jobs, work hard, and still live below the poverty level. Throughout Chester County, there are approximately 40,000 residents who fall within

Through a great example of "neighbor helping neighbor", the Hershey's Mill Volunteer Committee for CVIM has been raising money for Judy's Cookie Jar since 2005. Committee members Ginny Fanfera and Doris Mortimer explain that the Cookie Jar was established following an initial donation of \$1,000 to help raise funds for testing,

this category; and they represent many different ethnic groups.

CVIM, the first community-based volunteer clinic of its kind in Pennsylvania, was founded in Frazer in 1998. The clinic, which provides both medical and dental services, has a small paid professional staff and over three hundred volunteers.

While the Affordable Care Act and the expansion of Medicaid in Pennsylvania have increased access to health care for many adults and children, the fact remains that thousands continue to struggle to receive basic health care services necessary for them to work productively, provide for their families, or thrive in school. For nearly two decades, CVIM has remained a beacon of hope and a provider of health care for people in Chester County lacking access to care.

MRIs, other scans, and surgical treatments for CVIM patients. Judy Atticks, a nurse who works at CVIM, decided it was important to get an annual fundraiser going to help keep the Cookie Jar full to offer sustaining support to patients. Judy, who is 74 years old and lives in Harrisburg, still commutes to CVIM at least twice a week. Ginny and Doris describe her as "truly an angel" who is very passionate about the clinic, and dedicated to its continued success.

When Judy started the Cookie Jar, 18-20 very dedicated Hershey's Mill residents formed a committee to raise money for its continuation. The first year they raised \$4,990, and in 2015 they raised over \$13,000! Any money donated to the Cookie Jar goes straight to the patients; there are no overhead costs. Beginning in Ginny's home in Hershey's Mill, the committee has held

a fundraiser for Judy's Cookie Jar every year since 2005. As the committee and the number of supporters of the Cookie Jar grew, they moved the annual fundraiser to Sullivan House.

However, in recent years the committee has shrunk to half the size that it used to be, and the committee would like to reach out to the Hershey's Mill community for help. They have a chairman

from outside Hershey's Mill for the fundraiser this year, but they need additional committee members to help with the event. Committee members do not have to volunteer at the clinic or have a medical background, they just have to believe in the cause. Ginny explains that being on the committee requires little time, and attendance at meetings is not required.

Monetary support, particularly to cover the cost of renting Sullivan House (\$350) for the annual fall fundraiser, would be greatly appreciated. Other areas in need of support are food planning and set up, liquor costs for the fundraiser, and some muscles to help with set up and take down at the event. Items usually served at the event include finger foods, appetizers, drinks, and desserts. Skill with Excel spreadsheets would be helpful in tracking party information.

Former patients and recipients of aid from Judy's Cookie Jar often attend the fundraiser to tell their story and thank committee members for their support. This personal connection is very valuable as volunteers can experience firsthand where their money and efforts have been utilized.

So, if you would like to get involved, a little or a lot, this is a great opportunity. CVIM is a wonderful example of a community coming together to support those in need of help with medical and dental services. To help with the annual Judy's Cookie Jar fundraiser,

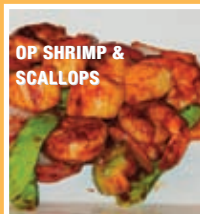

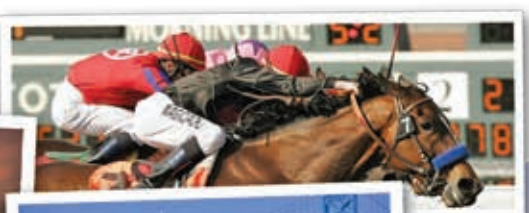

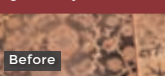

Hard to believe, but it was 48 years ago when we first stepped foot into the building that now houses Autograph Brasserie. (Spread) Eagle Village had just opened, and the new restaurant L'Auberge (French for inn) was *the*



place for fine French food. Since then, it has had several iterations – Le Mas Perrier, George’s, Peppercorn (all French food of some sort) – and now Autograph Brasserie with a contemporary menu inspired by flavors and classic dishes from France, Spain, Italy and America.

A year in the making, it is restaurateur Marty Grims’ newest venture. Among his others are the Moshulu Restaurant on Penn’s Landing, three White Dog Cafés, and others located on Long Beach Island. Grims has been a restaurateur for 30 years on the Main Line. He says of Autograph, “It is a modern American brasserie that celebrates those individuals who left their signature on popu-

lar American culture” as well as those European culinary inspirations “that have molded American cuisine today.” Hence the name Autograph – leaving one’s signature on a painting, picture, idea or even a special food dish.

Ralph Fernandez, former executive chef and partner in Moshulu, again joins Grims to create this restaurant concept that he dreamed of over 20 years ago. Autograph Brasserie weaves the definition of the word autograph throughout its décor, menu, and service.

Each room figuratively represents a different interpretation of an autograph, and we were seated in the Boulevard.

On each side were cozy, pri-



vate booths featuring photographs of well-known people. We were fortunate to have Jack Nicholson join us for brunch. The Sycamore Room is bright and airy with a large tree

in the center of a room with a lattice ceiling. The walls have shiny black and white images of Hollywood starlets. The largest room is the Club Room (or Living Room). The walls are lined with

banquettes and lush leather chairs with elegant, carved woodwork. The bar area is fascinating – and I will leave it as a surprise for you. This renovation must have come at no small cost. There is scrupulous attention to detail, and it is rather fun to visit other areas and see how Autograph is interpreted.

Be aware, it is a rather pricey restaurant – especially for dinner. However, you can enjoy a most delicious meal with creative ingredients and not “break

wiches. Several desserts are available, and we shared a strawberry-rhubarb tart – it was *magnifique!*

Appetizers include lobster bisque, Prince Edward Island mussels, warm goat cheese tart, achiole grilled shrimp, and yellow fin tuna crudo. To the salad entrées you can add grilled chicken, filet mignon, or grilled shrimp – for additional cost. Salads include burrata, mache, Catalan caesar, and warm duck confit.

I could hardly wait to see if eggs Benedict were among the brunch entrées. They were, and they were the

the bank” by going at lunch or brunch on Saturdays and Sundays. We were there on the tenth day of its opening, and there was not one glitch. If a sandwich seems just the thing, you may choose from grilled chicken pail-lard, open face crab melt, short rib Panini, tuna Nicoise club, grilled Portobello mushrooms, or a half-pound prime steak burger. All are prepared most imaginatively.

Autograph Brasserie has been given many "five-star" ratings on websites. Although I have visited just once, this seems a fair rating. Every bite was almost magical, and it is obvious that special care is taken in the kitchen to



enhance Chef Fernandez's creations.

Autograph Brasserie is located in Eagle Village in Wayne, and reservations are a good idea for weekends. They

are open seven days a week: Monday through Friday from 11:30am to 10pm; Saturday from 9:30am to 11pm; and Sunday from 9:30am to 10pm. Lunch is served during the week, and brunch is available Saturday and Sunday.

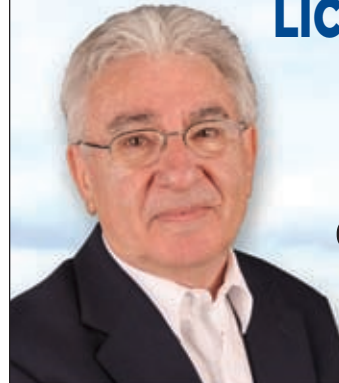

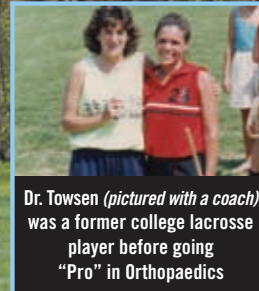

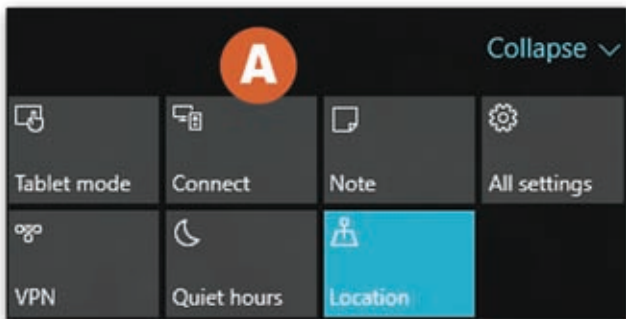

Customize the Action Center of Windows 10

Screenshot “A” is the Action Center. Here you can quickly and easily adjust your screen brightness, turn Wi-Fi on or off, switch on Quiet Hours (the Windows 10 notification-silencing feature), and more. You can collapse a portion of the Action Center window, and when you do, only four quick actions will be visible. You can choose which four appear. To open the Action Center, click the square icon near the clock. It may be all white, indicating you have notifications, or mostly black with 1 or 2 white lines meaning you have no notifications.



Open the Settings app, click System, and then Notifications & actions. Under the Quick actions heading, you’ll notice four boxes, each representing one of the four actions that remain visible at all times. Click the boxes to get a menu that lets you pick and choose which actions will get one of the four slots.

Toggle Notification Options

Under the Notifications subheading on the same Settings page, you’ll find a handful of general options that you can toggle on and off:

- *Show me tips about Windows:* When this is switched on, Windows 10 will occasionally serve up tips and tricks through its notifications feature. If you aren’t an experienced Windows user, you may find these useful; if

you’re more knowledgeable, you may find these annoying.

- *Show app notifications:* When turned on, you’ll receive notifications from apps installed on your PC.
- *Show notifications on the lock screen:* The lock screen appears before you sign in with your Windows password

and before your Desktop screen. If you have set up your PC without the password sign-in option, you will not see the Lock screen.

- *Show alarms, reminders, and incoming VOIP calls on the lock screen:* If you’re concerned about privacy, you may want to turn this off; but you may also find it convenient to see your appointment reminders at a glance.

- *Hide notifications while presenting:* When turned on, Windows 10 will prevent notifications from appearing on screen while you’re giving a PowerPoint presentation.

Silence Certain Notifications

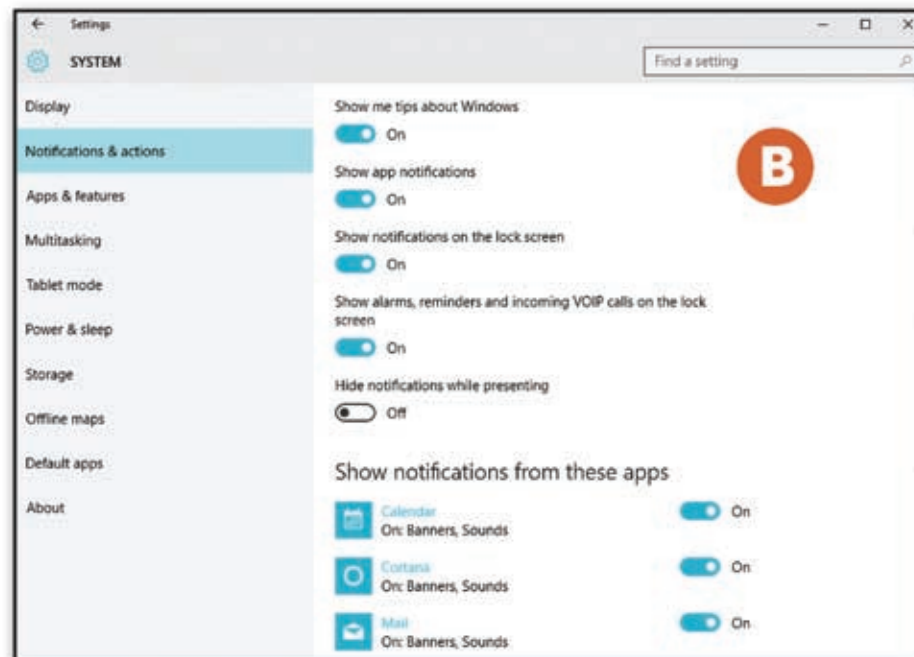
Would you rather not get an alert every time you get an email message? You’ll be happy to know that you can switch off notifications on a per-app basis. While at Settings > System > Notifications & actions, scroll down to the “Show noti-

fications from these apps” subheading. (See screenshot “B.”) The Notification & actions portion of the Settings app hides many options and tweaks.

To silence all notifications from a particular app, toggle the switch for that app to the “off” position. If you would like to receive some kinds of notifications from an app – for example, the notification banners but would rather not have an alert sound play – click the name of the app in question. Next, toggle the settings on the resulting screen

Open the Action Center by clicking the Action Center icon in the system tray. From here, you can delete individual notifications, clear out an entire section, or clear the whole thing by clicking Clear all in the upper right of the window.

To delete individual notifications, click the notification you want to get rid of, and click the “X” button that appears. If you would like to clear out an entire section, highlight the section heading and then click the “X” button.



as you desire. You can disable or enable notifications to suit your needs.

Clear out notifications

After a while, you might accumulate quite the collection of notifications in your PC’s Action Center. Clearing them out is easy.

The PC Club meetings are open to all regardless of computer experience. Bring your questions and we’ll try to answer them. Joe Kennedy | Princeton

Fanny Kemble's life spanned the Atlantic and most of the 19th century. She was remarkable for careers as an actress and a writer.

Kemble was born into a well-known theatrical family in London in 1809.

Butler was a Philadelphia man with strong ties to the South. He had inherited a large fortune that included a house in the city, a country estate north of the city, and a plantation in Georgia. When Butler saw Kemble on the stage, he began to court her. As she moved from city to city on tour, he followed along, playing the flute in the company's

She was tutored in the classics, music, literature, languages, and the social graces. Accounts of the day indicate that she was a bright young girl who wrote poetry. At age 19, she was forced to go onto the stage to recoup the failing fortunes of her family. In her debut in 1829 at Covent Garden, she received overwhelming acclaim, according to Kemble biographies. Within the next few years, she enjoyed success in both comedy and tragedy.



orchestra. Finally, she agreed to marry him in 1834.

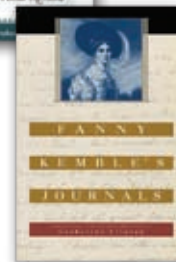
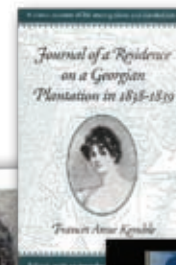
According to Wister's account in the historical society's bulletin, Butler wanted a trophy wife, which would mean that Kemble would have to give up the stage, obey her husband in all

things, and become totally dependent on him. And indeed, she gave up her career and turned over the money she made as an actress to her family in England. But Kemble, it seems, refused to give up her personality.

Journal of a Resident in America, to which she committed before her marriage, was published the first year Kemble and Butler were together. The book, which was critical of life in the United States, caused a stir in Philadelphia society and drove a wedge between the couple that widened over the years.

They moved to Butler Place, their country estate in Branchtown, six miles north of the city near Cheltenham Township. There, Kemble wrote poetry and became friends with a neighbor, Lucretia Mott (the noted abolitionist). In 1835, the couple had their first child, Sarah; their second child, Fanny, was born in 1838, the year the family moved to Butler Island in Georgia.

The family's plantation there was run by slaves,



and Kemble was shocked by the living and working conditions of the African Americans, expressing her dismay to her husband and his friends. They stayed in Georgia just one year before returning to Butler Place. But during their time in Georgia, she kept notes for a book she would write and publish later.

According to Wister's article, the 14 years Kemble was married to Butler were years of humiliation and isolation from society in general and her children in particular. In 1847, she could no longer stand the situation and received permission from her husband to visit her family in England. She never returned to Butler. In 1848, he sued for divorce on grounds of desertion; Kemble was granted an allowance of \$1,500 a year and the right to see her children each summer.

Kemble returned to the stage in England, and began writing a journal about her experiences living in the South. During the Civil War, her 1863 book, *Journal of a Resident on a Georgia Plantation*, and articles written for the *London Times* influenced British opinion in favor of the Union side.

After the war, Kemble did dramatic readings and wrote essays on the plays of Shakespeare. Her work was well received in Britain and the United States. She died in 1893 just short of her 84th birthday.

Aashe Maste

Beef and herb soup with yogurt.

- 2 large onions
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 tablespoon ground turmeric
- ½ cup yellow split peas
- 5 cups water
- 8 ounces ground beef
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon pepper
- 1 cup basmati rice
- 3 tablespoons each of fresh chopped parsley, cilantro, and chives
- 1 tablespoon butter
- 1 large garlic clove, finely chopped
- 4 tablespoons chopped fresh mint
- 2-3 saffron strands dissolved in 1 tablespoon boiling water
- Yogurt, unflavored & full-fat

In a large saucepan, heat oil and fry one chopped onion until browned. Add turmeric, peas, and water and bring

to a boil; then reduce heat and simmer for 20 minutes. Grate the other onion into a bowl and add beef and seasonings; mix well and form into 1¼" balls; add to pan and simmer for 10 minutes. Add rice and herbs and simmer for 30 minutes (rice will be tender). Melt butter in a small pan and gently fry garlic; add mint and saffron and stir into soup; simmer 3 minutes. Season soup with salt and pepper to taste, and garnish with small dollops of yogurt.

Borani Esfanaj

Spinach and yogurt appetizer or side.

- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, crushed
- 1 pound fresh spinach, chopped
- 2 cups yogurt, unflavored & full-fat
- Salt and pepper

In a large saucepan, melt butter and fry onion until browned. Add garlic and

spinach and cook, stirring occasionally, until moisture has evaporated. Remove from heat, stir in yogurt, season to taste, and allow to cool before serving.

Khoreshe Ghaimeh

Persian lamb with split peas. Serve with Chelo; this involved plain rice can be approximated with buttered and salted Basmati rice.

- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 1 pound lamb, cut into small cubes
- 1 teaspoon ground turmeric
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon curry powder
- 1¼ cups water
- 2-3 saffron strands
- ½ cup yellow split peas
- Juice of 2 small limes
- 4 medium tomatoes, chopped
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 2 large potatoes, chopped
- Salt and pepper



In a large saucepan, melt butter and fry onion until browned; then add lamb and cook until browned. Add turmeric, cinnamon, and curry and stir for 2 minutes. Add water and bring to a boil, then reduce heat and simmer, covered, for 30 minutes. Add saffron, peas, lime,

and tomatoes, and simmer for 35 minutes. Season to taste. In skillet, heat oil and fry potatoes until cooked and browned (10-15 minutes), season with salt; potatoes are served atop the dish.

Basbousa

Warm coconut cake with lemon syrup.

- ½ cup sugar
- ⅔ cup water
- 1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice
- ½ cup unsalted butter, melted
- ¾ cup sugar
- ½ cup flour
- 1¼ cups semolina
- 1½ cups grated coconut
- ¾ cup whole milk
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- Almonds

For syrup: In a small saucepan, add sugar, water, and juice, and stir while bringing to a boil; then reduce heat and simmer for 8 minutes until the syrup in thickened.
