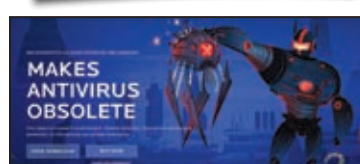

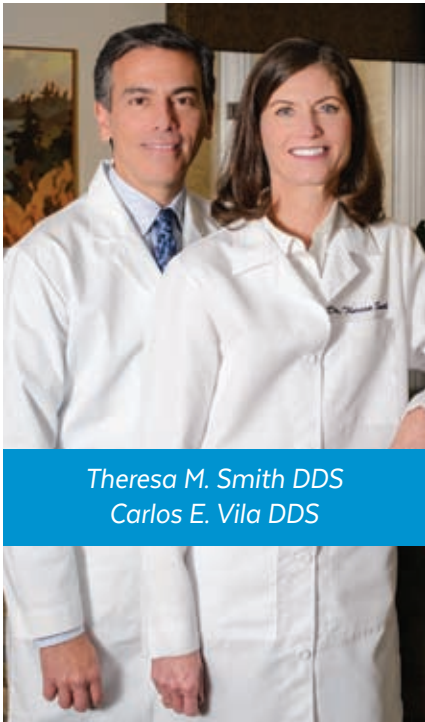

Lisa and George Groff recently celebrated 50 years of married life together. How did they make it to this amazing milestone? As George says, "Listen to your wife and just say 'okay!'" Actually, compromising often, being best friends, and enjoying activities together is their recipe for a happy marriage.

Lisa grew up in Conneaut Lake, a borough in Northwestern Pennsylvania. Its name comes from an Indian word meaning "Snow Waters".

She enjoyed attending Kent State, where she first majored in radio and television,

and later switched to education; earning a bachelor's degree. Coming from a small town, it was a whole new experience for her. In the summers, she had various jobs in Lake Placid, NY, including selling advertisements and doing commercials at a local radio station.

ing college-prep school located about 15 minutes from Princeton, NJ. He returned to West Chester and attended Henderson High for his senior year. George, who is 6'4", played basketball in prep school; and in one intramural game he scored 96 points! He later played in an adult basketball league in West Chester.

After high school, George enlisted in the army for two years. During the Cuban Missile Crisis he was stationed at Ft. Stewart, Georgia; and when President Kennedy was assassinated, he was at Ft. Hood in Killeen, Texas. During both of these tense episodes, his units were placed on alert; but fortunately, were not called up.

How did George and Lisa meet? When Lisa graduated with her degree in education, she wanted to return to West Chester to teach; after being there for the pageant. One of her students, named Karen, at South Junior High,

community theater in Lionville, PA. Eventually, they got together when Lisa was directing a show and she invited him to the cast party. That was their first date, and they've been together ever since! Before she met George, Lisa had applied to teach overseas and was accepted. After meeting George, she decided not to go. Locally, there were no job openings except in a Delaware County elementary school; where they were so desperate for teachers. So, Lisa taught 3rd grade there for 2 years. She then moved up to the high school, where she taught Political Science, Constitutional Law, and Theater Arts. She also directed all the plays, and introduced musicals to the district; beginning with

Oklahoma. It was during that time that Lisa and George were married.

Lisa and George also started a boutique, called Applause, in the Parkway Shopping Center in West Chester; which they owned and operated for about 5 years. She loved planning the shop, and decorating and ordering the clothing; but found it difficult to find the necessary time to be there. They hired a manager to help with the day-to-day running of the boutique, and eventually sold it to one of the customers.



During that period, Lisa went back to earn her master's degree in theater from Kent State. It was one month after the infamous shootings there, in May of 1970. She remembers seeing tanks on campus, which was very unnerving. However, she said that the University held workshops to help students deal with the tragedy.

After 30 years of teaching, Lisa retired; and for the next 10 years became an Independent Representative, and then a Regional Director, with Excel Communications. She and George took many trips to Dallas, which was the national

headquarters for training and workshops. Lisa currently volunteers with RSVP, the Retired Senior Volunteers Program, where she enjoys working in a middle school library. Through this program, senior volunteers who work in the community can defray some of their property taxes.

After returning from the service, George worked for Chrysler for 2 years; followed by 5 years with the New York Life Insurance Company. He then had a 27-year career as a salesman at

James Chevrolet in West Chester. Lisa proudly showed me the plaque that George received 4 years ago when he won the Melvin Jones Fellowship Award from the Lions Club; of which he has been an active member for many years. Through this organization, he has performed so many good deeds; such as raising money for eye exams (for underprivileged children), installing ramps for wheelchair-bound people, and working with Wings For Success (a program which helps disadvantaged women by providing professional clothing for job interviews). Many of his Mill friends also support these causes, which he greatly appreciates.

George has maintained friendships, begun in West Chester, from the time

he was 3 years old; and was given a plaque at his class reunion for helping his friends. One such friend, who was paralyzed in a sledding accident with his daughter, and was wheelchair bound for many years, was someone who George often helped. He has since passed away, but Lisa and George have kept in touch with his daughter; who calls George weekly and especially on Father's Day. George and Lisa also have "tons" of nieces and nephews, all over the country.

How did George and Lisa come to live in Hershey's Mill? When it was time to downsize from their home in West-

town, they looked at several 55-and-over communities, but liked Hershey's Mill the best; particularly because of its beautiful landscaping, and many activities available. As Lisa says, "Something has to be wrong with you if you don't like it here."

For their 50th wedding anniversary, this past October 15, they were planning to go to Hilton Head; but because of Hurricane Matthew, they couldn't get there. So they went to plan B; driving to Ocean City, NJ, with two couples with whom they've been friends all of their married life, and had a beautiful week! They even had special t-shirts made for the occasion.

They had no planned stops, so they just took their time seeing the sights, and stopping to see friends and relatives along the way. They loved the vistas in Colorado, and the coast of California; including Hearst Castle and

Big Sur. They also enjoyed Las Vegas, and Lake Havasu City in Arizona.

What's on their Bucket List? They would like to travel the Trans-Canadian Railroad across the Rocky Mountains, and go on a Mississippi River paddle-wheel trip.

Giving back has been a recurring theme in George and Lisa's lives. They are a generous, active, and fun-loving couple with many friends – who are very happy with their lives at Hershey's Mill and Hilton Head. As they say, "What else do you need?"

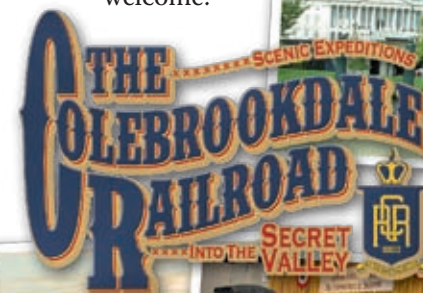

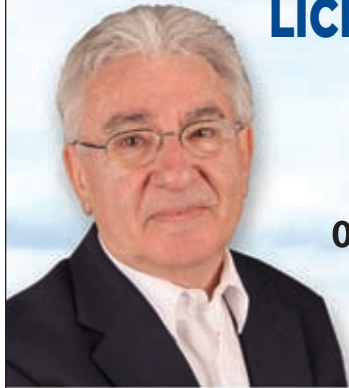

I can hear you all thinking what kind of name is EatNic? Me too. When asking one of the staff what it meant, she didn't know. She said to think beatnik or picnic. I think the owner, John Scardapane, thought it would evoke questions – and it does. The name usually includes “Urban Farmhouse Eatery & BYOB” and is likely there to clarify just what EatNic is. At least it is a name you won't forget easily.

EatNic was opened the day after Thanksgiving in 2016, and was founded by John Scardapane; one



executive chef; and recently, the executive chef at Silverspoon.

The building was completely renovated to allow for a comfortable atmosphere. Various levels of seating provide more



privacy and less noise. Re-purposed wood is used throughout the dining room, as well as restored furniture and vintage mirrors. It is

bright and cheerful. The waiting area is cozily decorated in “shabby chic”.

Something special they offer is a collection of beautiful crystal glassware, and this makes your BYOB experience just about perfect. Another plus is excellent and cheerful service. The servers are also knowledgeable about each item on the menu, and are happy to make adjustments.

I think the number of items on the menu are reasonable, and there is enough choice to satisfy most appetites. Entrées and salads are featured, with soup, sides, pizza, and a few small plates available. Small plates include crispy calamari with fried arugula, wild Atlantic mussels, and carrot hummus with fresh baked naan.

When reviewing the salad choices, don't be too stunned by the prices as they are hearty enough to be an entrée – and then some. Also, several of the salads are available as sides; and of course, are smaller. Salads are crunchy vegetable with cavolo nero kale, Brussel sprouts, cauliflower, broccoli, red quinoa, and toasted hazelnuts. I hope that indicates to you how satisfying they are to the appetite as they were to me. Other salads are apple kale salad, mixed greens, mushrooms and goat cheese with



mixed greens, crispy calamari, and Caesar. Chicken or shrimp can be added for an additional cost.

I think the entrées are the highlight of the menu. All seem to have a combination of flavors and ingredients to blend and complement the dish. Some available are: organic Ora king salmon; EatNic burger with fries; Griggstown Farm turkey burger; open-faced croquet madame (hickory smoked ham and Swiss, mornay sauce, fried egg and fries); prime New York

strip steak; wild caught shrimp with grits (which our friend thought was remarkable); and a house-favorite, 8-hour Bolognese. Everyone in our group enjoyed the meal, and said they would come back.

You may want to complete your dinner with dessert. Among your choices

are Anjou pear crisp, chocolate truffle, Chai sugar dusted doughnuts, and a caramel pecan tart.



All menus are updated every Monday, Wednesday and Friday, so what you read here may be different when you go. Lunch is offered, and breakfast is served all day. This is a child-friendly restaurant, and offers a kids menu.

“Farm to fork” means sourcing food locally and serving it within the shortest amount of time from harvest. The restaurant receives delivery from local family farms 7 days a week. EatNic is open seven days a week from 9am to 9pm, and is a BYOB.

Several friends recommended EatNic, and we were pleased with our dinner. Next time, I think I will try breakfast for dinner!

AdwCleaner, another anti-malware product, is a great complement to Malwarebytes. I think it’s good to have another assessment tool on your system; and it’s also available from Malwarebytes. To download it, go to www.malwarebytes.com/adwcleaner/. To use it, double-click the resulting file to launch it, and then click Scan; there is no formal installation. Follow screen prompts as necessary.

Not long after African Americans had won their freedom in 1863, a black Union soldier on sentry duty at Camp William Penn shot and killed a white man. The charge in *The Commonwealth v. Charles Ridley* was murder.

News coverage of the trial, as collected in the files of the Historical Society of Montgomery County, offers little information about Ridley; other than that he was apparently new to the army and was not from the area. According to trial evidence mentioned in the Soci-

According to the Historical Society's archives, Corson opened for the defense. He called as a witness the commander of Camp William Penn, Col. Louis Wagner, a Philadelphia native, to confirm that the camp was a legally organized federal post, and

Pvt. Charles Ridley at Camp William Penn

Located in what is now the village of LaMott in Cheltenham Township, Camp William Penn had itself come into existence because of the Emancipation Proclamation issued by President Lincoln. This said that as of January 1, 1863, all slaves shall "forever more be free." Widespread recruitment of African Americans into the Union Army followed, and Camp William Penn was created as a segregated training base for black soldiers.

On the evening of August 7, 1863, Charles Ridley, a private in the Sixth (Colored) Regiment of the Union Army, found himself on duty at the

ety's files, it was procedure at Camp William Penn to arm each sentry with a rifle and only one cartridge. Sentries were under the command of a corporal of the guard.

On the evening in question, William Fox, accompanied by another adult and three young boys, was returning from swimming in a nearby creek when he came upon Ridley at his post on the



wanted instead to take a shortcut through the camp, but Ridley ordered them off. One of the young boys, a nephew of Fox's, testified that Fox and Ridley exchanged racial slurs. At trial, Ridley denied this occurred.

Ridley called for instruction from the corporal of the guard, and a voice was heard from within the camp responding to his plea. Ridley asked how he should proceed, and the reply was "Shoot him" – which Ridley did. Fox died instantly.

An investigation resulted in Ridley's indictment on a charge of murder. He was confined in the Montgomery County prison, and went to trial in county court at Norristown in November 1863. Ridley was represented by James Boyd and George Corson, two of the county's most eminent lawyers. Trial evidence indicates Boyd and Corson took the case pro bono. Politically, the men were known to be pro-Union and antislavery.

that Ridley was a soldier in the Union Army under orders. Wagner also testified that the most important order a sentry received before going on duty was not to allow anyone to cross over the fence line into the camp.

An investigation by the Army had established that the "shoot order" did not come from the corporal of the guard, but probably from another soldier sentry. Still, Corson argued, at the time of the shooting Ridley believed he had received a lawful order from the corporal.

The jury returned a verdict of not guilty, and Ridley was acquitted. Local records do not reveal what happened to Private Ridley afterward.

At the close of the war, Camp William Penn was dismantled, and the lumber was used to build houses on the camp-site.

This is the first in a series of articles that will cover the history of the sporting activities in Hershey's Mill. It includes the impact they had, and are having, on our community's health, home values, and perception throughout the region.

Up until 2011, the sporting activities in Hershey's Mill were primarily tennis and paddle; golf isn't included in our conversation since it is privately owned. Tennis had between 70 and 100 players, some of who also played paddle, and the courts were used approximately 2 hours a day. These same players supported holiday events



Sullivan House each year, one in the spring (which kicked off the season) and another in the fall (which closed out the season).

Paddle had an interclub team for women which traveled to local clubs. There were some men who played regularly, and more who played occasionally. Eventually, the team dropped out of the league as they aged and other teams got younger. By 2015,

In 2011, things started to change. Pickleball was on its way to Hershey's Mill, and that would lead to a lot of changes!

Here's my story of how it started. I had been writing tennis articles for the Channel 20 Hershey's Mill newsletter, with Phyllis Panico's help, since 2005. One

month I wrote an article about pickleball, thinking it would be a great sport for us and inexpensive to start. A day or two after the newsletter was delivered, I received a call from "some guy" who asked "Would you like some help with Pickleball?" I said, "Yes. You just became its president!" That "guy" was Roger Karr, and we started with two courts (made by laying tape on tennis courts), 8 wooden paddles, and a dozen balls. The year was 2011.

Pickleball has gone from 0 players in 2011 to over 120 today; and one of our players is nationally ranked. However, what is most amazing is that 90% of players had never played a racquet sport before, and some had played no sport at all! All we could think was "what were they doing before pickleball, and how many others are sitting at home just waiting for the right activity to come along?"

originally been called the Tennis Club, but we have now changed it to the Hershey's Mill Sports Group (HMSG). The name now represents the variety of sports activities available at Hershey's Mill. The name change actually took on a life of its own when it occurred, and is quite a story, but I won't be sharing that now.

My article next month will probably include more about shuffleboard, horseshoes, paddle, and pickleball. As well as Bocce, biking, bowling, table tennis, off-site golf, CPR courses, billiards, and our conversion to "soft" tennis courts.

the courts were seldom used. To the credit of our Master Association, the courts were kept in good shape; always ready for the day when the sport came back to life – which it has.

We also had horseshoes and shuffleboard available, but neither were used much. The horseshoes were locked in the pool building, and the shuffleboard poles and discs were locked in the tack house near the Wood Shop. If you asked about the equipment, few knew if we had any, and even fewer knew where it was.

So during these waning days of winter, be adventurous, and assemble your own little rijsttafel for family and friends!



Nasi Uduk

Rice cooked in coconut milk; from Java. This twice-cooked method is a typical Indonesian one.

- 2 cups basmati rice
- 3 cups coconut milk
- 1 salam leaf
- ½ teaspoon salt

Put everything in a saucepan, bring to a boil, then turn off heat and cover; let stand 15 minutes (liquid will be absorbed). In a steamer, with foil on rack, pile rice and steam about 20 minutes until done.

Satay Pentul

Meatball barbecue; from Java. Soaked bamboo skewers and a flame grill are authentic, but these can cook fully in the pan (with a nice reduced sauce), or be done under the broiler.

- 3 cloves garlic, sliced
- ¼ cup sliced onion
- 1 tablespoon coriander
- ½ teaspoon ground cumin
- 1 teaspoon tamarind concentrate
- ½ teaspoon black pepper
- ¼ teaspoon nutmeg
- ⅓ teaspoon ground cloves
- ¼ teaspoon turmeric
- 1 tablespoon diced ginger (or laos)

- 2 cups coconut milk
- 1½ pounds ground beef
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 1 stalk lemon grass, chopped
- 1" cinnamon stick (or 1½ tsp ground)
- 1 tablespoon sugar

Blend garlic, onion, coriander, cumin, tamarind, pepper, nutmeg, cloves, turmeric, ginger, and ½ cup coconut milk. Mix ¾ of this with beef, eggs, and salt; and shape into 20 egg-shape ovals. Blend remaining mix and coconut milk with lemon grass, cinnamon, and sugar; then, in frying pan, bring to a boil and cook meatballs for 5 minutes (carefully turning once). Skewer meatballs (1-3 per) and grill, turning often and basting with a bit of the pan liquid, until done (about 5 minutes).

Sambal Kacang

Peanut sauce; typical throughout Indonesia. Wonderful for dipping the Satay Pentul. Best to use Asian style hot sauce.

- 1 clove garlic, crushed
- 1 tablespoon peanut oil

- 1¼ cups water
- 1 teaspoon hot red chili sauce
- 2 teaspoons tamarind concentrate
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 1-2 tablespoons sugar (to taste)
- ¼ teaspoon shrimp paste
- 1 cup smooth peanut butter

Fry garlic in the oil for 1 minute, then add everything but peanut butter and

- 3 cloves garlic, sliced
- 2 moderately hot red chilies, sliced

bring to a simmer. Add peanut butter and stir well, then simmer 5 minutes more. Serve hot or warm.

Bumbu Bali Daging

Spicy beef in red sauce; from Bali. Served over Nasi Uduk cuts the heat a bit.

- 2 moderately hot red chilies, sliced
- ¼ cup sliced onion
- 2 cloves garlic, sliced
- ½ cup sliced red sweet peppers
- 2 cups coconut milk
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 2 teaspoons sugar
- 1 tablespoon diced ginger (or laos)
- 2 salam leaves
- 2 kemiri nuts, crushed (or substitute with macadamia)
- ½ teaspoon shrimp paste
- 1 teaspoon tamarind concentrate
- 1 pound boneless beef chuck, cut into 1-1½" cubes

Blend chilies, onion, garlic, peppers, and ½ cup coconut milk; then add to a saucepan with other ingredients, and cook over medium heat, stirring occasionally, until tender (about an hour).

Sambal Goreng Buntjies

Spiced string beans; from Java. Chinese beans are tender and without strings; if

- 1 pound Chinese string beans
- 1½ cups coconut milk
- ¼ teaspoon shrimp paste
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon tamarind concentrate
- 2 salam leaves
- 1 tablespoon diced ginger (or laos)
- 2 cups cubed tomatoes

Fry onions, garlic, and chilies in the oil for 3 minutes, then add the beans (cut in half) and cook, stirring often, for 2 minutes more. Add remaining ingredients and cook over medium heat, basting/stirring often, until cooked but crunchy (about 10 minutes).

Godok Godok

Mashed banana fritters; from Sumatra. Eat as dessert, or a side to spicy dishes.

- 5 ripe bananas (about 2 pounds)
- 1½ cups rice flour
- 2 tablespoons dark brown sugar
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- ½ cup peanut oil

Mash bananas, then mix well with remaining except for oil. In frypan with the oil hot, and in batches, drop heaping tablespoons of the mixture and cook 2 minutes each side; until golden brown. Drain well, and serve warm.
