





issues. Don't confuse the Verizon FIOS ONT box with the router. The ONT box is wall mounted and has green lights, the router has a single white light on the front at the top.

Understanding FIOS 150/150 Internet Connection Speeds

concerning the FIOS transition. One of Now to really confuse things, there the specifications included the Internet connection speed residents would have. The higher the number, the faster web pages, downloaded files and movie streaming would load into the computer resulting in faster and smoother Internet operation. The 150/150 (download/ upload) specification is accurate and consistent with FIOS in Hershey's Mill. However, this specification is only valid when your device is connected to the Verizon router via an Ethernet cable. If you connect to the Internet via a wire-

less connection (Wi-Fi) this specification does not apply. This is due to the architecture of Wi-Fi which is completely different from a wired connection. Some issues that come into play are the distance your Wi-Fi device is from the interference router. from your neighbors operating on the same frequency or channel, the hardware inside your device and other

are actually two connection speeds involved with a Wi-Fi connection. The first is the 150/150 speed coming into the router from Verizon FIOS. This is fixed per the bulk contract between Hershey's Mill and Verizon. This speed may be higher if you opted for it during sign-up. The second speed is the Wi-Fi speed between your device and the Wi-Fi portion of the Verizon FIOS router. This is the one to observe since your device is constantly adjusting itself to maximize a fast, stable connec-


> tion. To check this, open the Control Panel and then click Network and Sharing Cen-

ter. The Control Panel can be accessed by typing "co" (no quotes) in the "Type here to search" field in the lower left corner of the Desktop screen for Windows 10, then pressing the Enter key. In Category view, click on "View network status and tasks" or in "Large icon" view click "Network and Sharing Center". Next, across from "Connections:" click your Internet

connection. The "Speed:" number you see represents a combination of the computers with up to date components can theoretically achieve up to a Speed: number above 150 Mbps, you FIOS speed is set at 150 Mbps. The bottom line is that anything above 54 Mbps can give you a satisfactory network experience although higher is better. Below 54 Mbps may also work slower in downloading information.

In addition there are two web sites I recommend that can check your download/upload speeds. Keep in mind that when running a web-based speed test, it combines both the base FIOS speed and the speed between your device and the router. One is www.speedtest.net. Click on "Change Server" and select "New Castle, De. - Comcast" then click "Go". It seems the Comcast server provides a more accurate speed test than the one from Line Systems. The other is from Verizon. The address is: https://www.verizon.com/SpeedTest/ learnspeedtest.aspx.



One of the most inspiring stories to come out of the Second World War was the heroic action of four chaplains during the sinking of the Dorchester, a U.S. Army attack transport, in the North Atlantic on Feb. 3, 1943.

The chaplains – the Rev. George Fox (Methodist), Rabbi Alexander Goode (Jewish), Clark Poling (Reformed),

and the Rev. John Washington (Roman Catholic) – gave up their life jackets, and lives, to save others on the ship. Survivors wrote, "I saw all four chaplains taking off their life belts and giving them to soldiers who had none."

"They were praying and talking with the men."

"They stood near the rail praying for those already in the water as the ship went under."

"I think their names should be on a list of the greatest heroes of the war."

These are just a few of many statements in affidavits sent to the U.S. Army by survivors.

Locally, a small organization, the Chapel of the Four Chaplains, has worked for many decades to maintain the memory of the sacrifice these men of faith made. The chapel in that time has migrated from the Temple University campus to a temporary home in Valley Forge to the Naval Business Center, formerly the Philadelphia Naval Shipyard.

The Dorchester was sailing in a convoy out of Newfoundland bound for Greenland. The ship carried a crew of approximately 150 and more than 700

soldiers and passengers. About four o'clock on a frigid morning, the ship was hit on the starboard side by a torpedo from a German submarine. The explosion ripped a large hole in the hull, stopped the engines, and caused a list. Within three minutes, the captain gave the order, "Abandon ship!"

Only two lifeboats and a few rafts were launched before the ship began to go down by the bow. The Dorchester



sank in just 20 minutes. More than 600 people lost their lives, mostly to hypothermia. U.S. Coast Guard Cutters escorting the convoy rescued about 180 people.

The four chaplains were posthumously awarded the Purple Heart and the Distinguished Service Cross. "Their calm attitude and sacrifice were later acknowledged by Congress, which voted to ...award them a medal of heroism," Robert M. Browning, Jr. wrote in U.S. Merchant Vessel War Casualties of World War II.

After the war, the Rev. Daniel J. Poling of Philadelphia, father of Clark Poling, founded the Chapel of the Four Chaplains with its headquarters at the Baptist Temple on the Temple campus. President Harry S. Truman dedicated the chapel in 1951.

In 1990, the Four Chaplains organization was forced to look for new quarters when the University announced plans to demolish the Baptist Temple. The school later decided to restore the building but by then the chapel was gone.

A local jeweler, Jack Kellmer, donated two acres in the Valley Forge area, and plans were drawn up to build a chapel there. The cost was set at \$2.5 million. A temporary chapel was set up at the Valley Forge Mall, west of Phoenixville on Route 23. But the chapel was never built because the money was not raised. The plan had to be abandoned.

Since 2001, the Four Chaplains organization has been housed in the chapel of the old Navy Yard. The chapel has two striking pieces of artwork that illustrate the courage of the four men of God.

A six by ten foot mural painted in 1951 by Nils Hogner depicts the four chaplains giving up their life belts to others as the Dorchester is sinking. A painting by Dudley Gloyne Summers done in 1945 shows the four standing hand in hand as the ship goes down. For

many years it hung in the Brotherhood Building of the National Conference of Christians and Jews in New York City. It is now on permanent loan to the chapel.



A recent article in the Philadelphia Inquirer indicated that the chapel was now holding a yearly opioid symposium with support going directly to victims suffering from the addiction.

The story of the chaplains also lives on at the Immortal Chaplains Foundation on the campus of Hamline University in St. Paul, Minnesota. And the tale has been told over and over in newspaper and magazine articles and books. In 2004 the book *No Greater Glory: The Four Immortal Chaplains and the Sinking of the Dorchester in World War II*, by journalist Dan Kurzman was published.

RECIPES

Summer is perfect for soup and salad, and the recent World Cup has us remembering hearty Russian fare from our time in Saint Petersburg. If your goal is trying something new and delicious, these recipes should be an easy score!

Solyanka (соля́нка)

A Russian sweet and sour beef soup.

1¹/₄ pounds beef (trimmed chuck)

3 ounces salami (hard)

6 ounces kielbasa sausage

5 ounces boneless ham

5 whole black peppercorns

3 whole allspice berries

1 bay leaf

5 ounces bacon, minced

1 large yellow onion, thinly sliced

1½ stalks celery, thinly sliced

¼ head cabbage, cored and shredded

7 tablespoons tomato paste

1 (15-oz.) can peeled whole tomatoes in juice, crushed

6 cups beef stock

2 large dill pickles, chopped

2 tablespoons capers, drained

 $\frac{1}{4}$ cup pitted black olives, sliced

2 tablespoons sugar

½ lemon, very thinly sliced Salt and black pepper

Garnish with chopped parsley, sliced scallions,

and sour cream

Cut the four meats to ¼" cubes. Make a cheesecloth sachet with the peppercorns, allspice, and bay leaf. In a large saucepan, over medium-high heat, cook bacon until fat is rendered, then add meats and cook until browned. Add onion, celery, cabbage, and

Add onion, celery, cabbage, and tomato paste, and cook until soft. Add tomatoes, stock, and sachet, and bring to a boil; then reduce heat to medium, add pickles and capers, and cook until beef is very tender. Remove sachet, add olives, sugar, and lemon, and season to taste. Cook a few minutes, then serve with garnish.

Olivier Salad (Салат Оливье)

The famous Russian "potato salad".

3 medium russet potatoes

1 large red potato

4 large carrots

1 pound fresh sweet peas

8 eggs

1¼ pounds bologna

6 dill pickles

3 sweet pickles

2 seedless cucumbers

2 cups mayonnaise

2 teaspoons wine vinegar

1½ teaspoons Dijon mustard

1 sweet onion, minced

Salt and freshly ground pepper Garnish with fresh chives

Boil unpeeled potatoes and carrots just until tender, then cool and cut

into cubes. Blanch the peas, then cool. Hardboil the eggs, then cool, peel, and cube. Cube bologna, pickles, and cucumbers. Combine all above with mayonnaise, vinegar, mustard, and onion. Season to taste, then serve with garnish.


