SECURITY

The phone number for Hershey's Mill Security is 610-436-6403. Please keep it handy. If you have an emergency requiring police, fire or ambulance, call 911 or if you are not able to reach the phone, press the RED emergency button in your bedroom or at the front door. Our security is connected with the 911 system so they are aware if you call in an emergency and security will usually arrive at your house before the emergency responders to assist them getting into your house.

That being said, in order for them to assist the emergency responders to get into your home, your front door key **MUST** be keyed to the Master Key which our Security has. This is for your safety so, if you have changed your locks and not had it keyed, please do it ASAP. You can call A-1 Security at 610-647-5042 to have it done immediately (homeowners expense).

Our Security is not permitted to admit anyone onto Hershey's Mill property without your authorization. It is important that your contact information, anytime list, etc. is accurate. Shortly, we will all be receiving a letter from Security requesting that we complete updated Resident Information and Gate Entry Device Information forms. Please complete these forms in a timely manner and return the forms to Security by November 1, 2016.
