Message from the Vice President

Summer is here, and the village is looking great with the new mulch. The rain is making everything green – now we could use some sunshine!

The FIOS installation is still moving along, but quickly coming to an end for all of Hershey’s Mill. We are getting used to the new channels and changes from Comcast. I’ve learned a few things that may be helpful to you.

- Wireless Discount – I am told that when the project is completed, we will be offered a 22% data discount on our Verizon wireless bills (probably this Fall).
- Voice Commands using Alexa – If you have Amazon’s Alexa or Echo Dot, you can setup FIOS for voice commands such as: changing or finding channels, searching for shows, and Pause, Fast-forward, Rewind & Play.
- DVR Recording – If you have DVR service and you miss the beginning of a show that is currently running, you can go to the guide and record the show. The show will record from the beginning, so you can go to DVR and watch the whole show.
- Rewinding to Avoid Commercials – There are times when I turn on a news channel in the middle of the broadcast. I then hit “Rewind” and

the show rewinds up to an hour. I can then watch (Play) and “Fast-Forward” through commercials and items of little interest.

- Verizon FIOS Digital Voice - User Guide – You can find the user guide on the internet. I have found many features new to me such as: setting up voice mail, blocking calls, seeing messages on the TV, etc.

Enjoy sports this Summer at Hershey’s Mill with golf, tennis, bocce, the pool and many other activities.
