

# Mid-Winter Warning v snow

Please be VERY aware of "black ice". This almost-transparent form of ice can be treacherous for walkers and drivers, as it accumulates on outdoor surfaces, such as roadways and sidewalks, and is extremely difficult to detect. During this time of year, the Security Department responds to a high number of emergencies that are the result of a person slipping and

falling on black ice. Storing Ice Melt

or salt near your home's front door is an excellent idea. You don't want to use a slippery walkway to get the Ice Melt or salt stored in your garage.

Various villages use several different snow removal companies. Residents with concerns about the condition of the walkways or roadways within their village should contact their respective management company rather than Security. Security does not have the authority to request snow removal services within a village.

Also, for the safety of other drivers and pedestrians, please remember to clean all snow and ice from your vehicle before driving.

## **Buying a New Computer**

The last time I wrote about buying a new computer was for the August 2016 *Guide and Digest*. Since then a number of changes have taken place. Desktop computers with a monitor are still viable and are often slightly less expensive than laptops with equal specifications. What can be confusing when shopping for a computer is the terminology and the technical specifications. Although space doesn't allow for a complete primer on the subject, I'll tell you what you need to know.

First, decide whether you want a laptop or a desktop. Laptops offer certain advantages over a desktop. You get portability with plenty of processing power. However there are disadvantages too. A somewhat smaller screen may strain your eyes over a period of time. A smaller keyboard makes for cramped typing. Glossy screens are great for sharpness and contrast but don't sit with a sunny window behind you. The glossy screen acts as a mirror reflecting the light from the window thus making the screen harder to see. Another item to consider is the touchpad. A touchpad allows you to mimic the mouse. Some people have trouble using the



touchpad and prefer to connect a real mouse to the laptop. That's fine if that's your preference.

My minimum hardware recommendations for both laptops and desktops require that they have 4 core processors. Four cores refer to 4 computer processors in one package. Names like i5 and i7 made by Intel are best. AMD, an Intel competitor, is also an excellent choice. AMD Ryzen 5 and Ryzen 7 processors are the best choices within the AMD brand. Computers with Intel i3 processors can serve for everyday computing single task needs such as Internet surfing, email, and word processing but are limited in processing power and don't offer much to offset higher demands now or in the future. An i5 processor can handle almost all demands put on the processor. An i7 processor is the fastest and most expensive processor and is aimed toward serious gamers and multitasking. When buying a new computer choose a computer whose processor has 4 cores and 8 threads. Threads provide additional performance to the 4 cores. Also the speed rating of the processor is important. The higher it is the faster your computer will run. A good choice would be a 3GHz or higher speed processor. Keep in mind that processors have a low idle speed that extends battery life when there are no programs running. An idle speed rating around 1.5GHz is normal. When a demand is executed the speed will increase to nearly the full rated speed. The higher the speed the faster the computer will run Apps (programs).

Here's how to find a processor that meets my recommendations. After making a choice on a new computer, note the model number of the computer. Your choice may come from an in-store or online visit. Don't buy on your first visit to a store. Google the computer model number online and look for the specifications. It's best to choose the specifications from the manufacturer's website. To keep up with technology, the right processor and a SSD drive (Solid State Drive-no moving parts) will add years to the usability of the computer.

My recommendation for an Internet, email, word processing, photo editing and light gaming computer would have a 3 GHz or higher speed 4 core 8 thread Intel i5 processor, 8 GB's or more of RAM, and a 256 GB or higher solid state drive such as a Dell 15 3000 model 3593. There are many other options available for computers that help personalize it for your needs and of course add to the cost. A DVD drive is now an option on some laptops but unavailable on most. What I've outlined here would be suitable for most HM residents. Other things to consider are the number of ports (USB & HDMI) for your needs.

WARNING: Store configurations for any model computer can vary from the manufacturer's website offering. The Dell 3593 is no exception!


Both laptops and desktops feature the Windows 10 operating system. Shop for popular brands, such as HP, Dell, and others. I favor Dell because of good reliability, easy online ordering and less junkware installed compared to other brands. Before going to a store become familiar with a manufacturer's line of computers by visiting their web sites. HP can be found at www.hp.com, Dell is at www.dell.com. Avoid the low cost, \$300-\$400, computers or computers that have Celeron or Pentium processors. They can be annoyingly slow if speed is a priority for your needs. A higher priced computer also offers future proofing, which means the computer will operate at nearly the same speed in future vears as it does now.

More help in purchasing a Windows 10 computer can be obtained by attending the PC Club meeting on the third Tuesday of each month at 7 p.m. in the Community Center. Our next meeting will be on February 18.

Each date will feature two identical 30 minute presentations followed by a question and answer dialogue. The presentations will start at 10:30 a.m. and 1 p.m. Any resident signed up for either presentation is welcome to a light lunch at noon, courtesy of PECO.

All appointments for an Energy Assessment must be made between 10:30 a.m. and 2 p.m. in the Community Center on the presentation dates. To speed up the scheduling process, please bring your PECO account number, and your calendar. To reserve seat at a presentation, sign up at the Community Center during the last week in January for a date and time from the following options: Th., Feb. 6, Sat.,



Feb. 15, Sat., Feb. 22, , and Th. Feb. 27. Snow date is Th., March 5, which will not be held unless required. Check the Community Center, after March 2, for additional information.

## **Claude Rains**

During the same period when he was starring opposite such movie queens as Bette Davis, Vivien Leigh and Ingrid Bergman, versatile actor Claude Rains was a resident in this region trying to perfect his role as a farmer.

"Hollywood to me is a pace to work Home is Chester County." Rains said in a 1950 interview with Philadelphia Inquirer Magazine.

Rains was born in London into a theatrical family in 1889. At age 11 his father gave his permission to young Rains to give up his formal education to take a part in a London stage production. Except for a four year period during World War I he worked on the English stage until about 1926.

In 1915, Rains joined a Scottish regiment, saw action in France, was gassed at Vinny Ridge and rose to the rank of Captain.

After the war, he married the first of six wives and in the mid 1920's sailed to America to try his luck on the New York stage. Rains worked regularly in New York and in summer stock until 1933, during the Depression. He was unable to get parts that year, and at age 44 felt his career in the theater was over. He used his savings to buy a small farm near Lambertville, NJ. But, he found he had little time for farming after his agent landed him the lead in a film, The Invisible Man, launching his career in the movies.

When his farm building in Lambertville was struck by lightning and burned to the ground, he bought a farm near Glen Mills, Delaware County, in 1935. That same year he married his fourth wife, Frances Prop-



per of New York City. The marriage produced Rains only child, Jennifer. In 1938, Rains became a US citizen.

Rains bought his third farm, a 320 acre estate in West Bradford Township Chester County, in 1941. He and his family would live there until about 1956. It was during this time that he was involved in many popular films

for which he earned critical acclaim and Oscar nominations for supporting actor. These movies were Mr. Smith Goes to Washington, Casablanca, Mr. Skeffington and Notorious. He never won an Academy Award.

On the screen he projected a dominant image, but in fact he stood 5 foot 6 and when he appeared in public was self-conscious about his height.

While he lived in Chester County, he was noted for giving dramatic readings for fund raising events in support of patriotic and charitable causes. In 1956, Rains and his wife Frances were divorced. And in 1958 he sold his farm and moved into a large home on Church Street in West Chester. By this time he was working more in radio and television than in films. An article in the West Chester Citizen said Rains lived quietly at his home.

In 1959, Rains married for the fifth time to Aagi Jambor, a Bryn Mawr College professor, in a civil ceremony in West Goshen Township. The marriage ended in divorce nine months later. In 1960 he married Rosemary Clark, a writer and artist, also from West Chester. She died in 1965.

At the beginning of the 1960s, Rains was all but retired. But director David Lean brought him back to the movies for his last film, Lawrence of Arabia. In this film he played a British diplomat in a supporting role.

Rains sold his home in West Chester about 1963 and moved to Bucks County. H appeared on the stage of the Bucks County Playhouse, but illness cut short his appearances.

His last move was to Laconia NH. There Rains, the star of more than 50 films, died in 1967 at the age of 77.



## Let's keep our **Clean Water** out of the

Sewer

Eileen Hotte | Quaker

Are you aware where all the water in Hershey's Mill goes? You probably know that rainwater from our roofs, roads and driveways run into the storm water drains and end up in the many water retention areas, ponds and streams of Hershey's Mill. Of course, water from our kitchens and bathrooms ends up in the sanitary sewer system and is treated by the Greenhill Sewer Plant before being sprayed onto the golf course and other fields. There is one source of water, however, which is more hidden, but is equally important, and that is the condensate water from your HVAC system or other dehumidifiers in your home.

Where does the condensate water from your air conditioner go? The answer may be more important than you think. First, East Goshen Township regulations require that all sump pumps and condensate pumps not discharge into sanitary sewer systems. That is, they must drain outside. If this is not the case for your house, you may be required to make this change during a township inspection. Equally important as meeting Township Regulations is the realization that condensate water going into our sanitary sewer may adversely affect our ability to properly treat and dispose of our waste water. We have 1700 units at Hershey's Mill. In the

Philadelphia area, we experience over 90 days a year when air conditioners and dehumidifiers are working hard to keep us comfortable. And as you may realize, it seems that our summers are getting longer and hotter! As a result, if all of our homes are discharging the condensate improperly, up to 2 million gallons of clean water would enter the sanitary sewer and our treatment plant each year. During those warmer months this represents 10% of our sanitary waste flow. When we experience rainy years, like the past 2, our plant is close to capacity!

What can you do? Ask the technician who services your heater/air conditioner to inspect the discharge lines and determine where the condensate goes. If it does not go to the exterior of your house, you should ask for a cost estimate to change it so that it does drain to the exterior. You will then be aware of possible future expenses to correct this situation. If you have a new HVAC installed, be sure your contractor correctly drains the condensate to the exterior of your home. If not, a township inspection of the work may reveal you will have to make the change. Of course, when you go to sell your home, again, a Township Inspection may indicate this noncompliance and you will be required to correct it.

The bottom line is that East Goshen Township Regulations forbid discharges to the sanitary sewer system from AC condensate, humidifiers, dehumidifiers and sump pumps. Our own Greenhill Sewer Plant is adversely affected when this water flows into the sanitary sewer. The Greenhill Sewer Association of Directors is hoping to educate all residents about this issue and to encourage compliance with the township regulation.

During the spring and summer months, wood-boring bees proliferate throughout Hershey's Mill. Nesting is the goal of the bees' industrious boring activities. Unfortunately, their natural nesting instinct often results in significant damage to the soffits, fascia and wood trim of our homes. Making matters worse, hungry woodpeckers cause further damage by drilling into the bees' nests in search of food. These bees are also fairly aggressive during their season and "dive-bomb" people who come near them.

Recognizing that wood-boring bees will cause recurrent seasonal problems, Karl Grentz, President of Glenwood Village (currently President of the Hershey's Mill (HM) Master Association Board of Directors) and Dave Nagurney, member of the HM Woodshop Leadership Committee decided to investigate possible solutions. Ultimately, they tested two styles of beespecific traps in Glenwood and had great success in decreasing both the wood-boring bee population and the damage they cause.

Based on their success, Karl asked Dave if the HM Woodshop would be willing to undertake the project of building a quantity of bee traps for use

in Glenwood Village. After some research, the Woodshop Leadership Committee agreed to the request and set about constructing a prototype similar to the traps already successfully tested in Glenwood.

Tim Cordes, a member of the Woodshop's Leadership Committee coordinated the proj-



ect and built the master prototype. From there, Arnold Auger, Woodshop founding member and Master Carpenter, constructed a "jig" from which the main bee trap body would be cut and reproduced repetitively, maintaining the same accuracy with every compound-angle cut.

Next came production. Joe Ritter, Woodshop volunteer member, went to work on fabrication. Using Arnold's jig and the Woodshop's exceptional collection of tools, Joe cut, drilled, and assembled 50 bee traps. The traps' compact size and simple design belie the complexity of Joe's work! Peggy McCall,

another Woodshop volunteer member, then applied a wood preservative finish to each trap. Finally, a removable Mason jar was attached to the bottom of each trap to serve as a reservoir for the bees that enter the trap.

The last step will take place in spring 2020 when Woodshop volunteers hang the traps in optimal locations throughout Glenwood Village.



Everyone involved in the project is confident that the traps will do their intended job of controlling wood-boring bees. It is the hope of the Woodshop that other villages will follow Glenwood's lead and take action to prevent the annual damage caused by these bees. Bee traps can be ordered from the Woodshop – individually or collectively as with Glenwood at the

installed price of \$15, which is about half the cost to purchase a trap commercially. Bee traps can be ordered from the Woodshop – individually or collectively (as with Glenwood) – at \$15.00 (installation available), which is about half the cost to purchase a trap commercially.

This project is just one example of the mutual benefit that can be realized when HM residents and Woodshop collaborate. Glenwood Village is now on-track to minimize wood damage in 2020 and beyond at a very reasonable cost and no more dive-bombing! At the Woodshop, volunteer members had an opportunity to put their woodworking skills into practice, while providing a service to their neighbors. ## COMMUNITY GARDENS Ed Sweeney | Yardley

In the January *Guide and Digest*, Bill Reynolds shared some great garden tips. This month, he focuses on vegetable compatibility. Most leafy vegetables like lettuce, kale, and arugula grow well when planted in proximity to one another. The same goes for members of the cabbage family. Mixing vining plants like melons, squash, and cucumbers should be avoided given space needs and insect concentration.

Planting green/sugar peas in early spring for a late spring/early summer

crop and planting bush/pole beans thereafter can yield a long season of sweet, crisp legumes. Use soil inoculant to ensure quick germination, growth and production. Starting seedlings under lights is another way to get a head start on growth.

## HOLD THAT FLUSH! Eileen Hotte | Quaker

You may have seen some activity across the street from the Club House this fall and wondered what was happening. One of our "pools" was getting a facelift!

No, this is not the swimming pool at The Cove, but one of the three pools or "cells" that are part of the Greenhill Sewer Plant. Constructed during the early days of Hersey's Mill, this facility plays an important role in treating our wastewater, which is eventually sprayed on the Hershey's Mill Golf Club or adjacent fields.

Every time you run your washing machine or flush your toilet, you contribute to the over 80 million gallons of wastewater that flows through this facility each year. The Greenhill Sewer Plant handles sewage from all the houses in Hershey's Mill, along with Wellington and the businesses in the Giant Shopping Center. Once solid material is removed, the wastewater is allowed to pass from one pool or cell to two others, all the while being aerated. This allows bacteria to break down the waste over time. You may be as surprised as me to learn that each cell is 15 feet deep!

Our waste treatment facility has been operating for 37 years. It plays an integral role in safely and responsibly treating and releasing our wastewater to the environment. With the good maintenance that is routinely performed, we hope it continues for another 37 years!

#### Recipes

It happens every year. We see the New Year's ball drop, and remember our time in New York. Buying great knishes in Brooklyn, and "bagel spread" at Zabar's, was easy back then. Now, we sweat the details and make them great ourselves!

#### **Cream Cheese Spread**

No lowfat dairy, and whisking for a lighter texture is worth the effort!

1 small clove garlic

1 pound cream cheese, softened

½ cup sour cream

1/8 teaspoon kosher salt

½ cup finely chopped scallions

Using a mortar and pestle, make a smooth paste of the garlic. Scrape into a bowl with remaining and whisk. Cover, and refrigerate at least 2 hours.

#### **Knishes**

Individual knishes are popular now, but our older hands don't make them!
2½ tablespoons schmaltz (see recipe)
2½ cups chopped onions
Russet potatoes (to yield 2 cups mashed) and 1 tablespoon milk
Salt and ground pepper to taste
1¾ cups all-purpose flour (bleached)
⅓ cup cake flour
1¼ teaspoons baking powder
1 teaspoon kosher salt
2½ tablespoons vegetable oil
2 eggs, well beaten
For filling: In a saucepan, cook onions

in schmaltz until slightly soft, then

set aside. Roast potatoes, mash with

the milk, mix into the onions, then season to taste. For dough: In a bowl, whisk together flours, baking powder, and salt. Mix in oil, eggs, and 3-4 tablespoons water to form a ball, then turn out and knead until smooth (use as little bench flour now, and later, as possible). Return to bowl, cover, and refrigerate for 2 hours. Assemble and bake: Preheat oven to 350°F. Divide dough and roll out half to a long rectangle a bit thinner than ¼". Spread half the filling on the long edge, about 1" in, then roll up and seal edge and ends. Do other half, then place rolls onto oiled sheet pan and bake until browned (35-40 mins.). Let cool a bit, then slice and serve with the cream cheese spread.

To make schmaltz (and gribenes), dice 1 pound of chicken skin and fat, then simmer it in a skillet with 1 cup of water until the water evaporates. Grate 1 small yellow onion and add it to the skillet along with 1½ teaspoons kosher salt. Increase heat to medium and cook, stirring often, until the skin begins to crisp and the onions are caramelized. Strain and press out the liquid, which is schmaltz. The solids, gribenes, we freeze and use when making chicken gravy.


